Naples, July 8.

The late Eruption of Mount Vefuvius feems to have occafioned a fenfible Alteration in the Seafon. For Three Weeks paft fcarcely a Day has paffed without a violent Storm of Thunder, Lightning and heavy Rain, quite unufual here in the Month of July; and the Damage done to the fertile Lands at the Foot of the Mountain, by Torrents of Water mixed with the Puzzolane Ashes (and which immediately forms into a hard Cement) is inconceivable. In fome Places the Soil is covered by it, not lefs than Four Feet in Thicknefs. The Volcano begins now to make it's Appearance from under the Clouds of Ashea and Smoke which had obscured it ever fince the beginning of the Eruption. It has loft near One-thurd of the Height of it's Cone; and to make up for that Lofs, feveral very confiderable conical Hills, with deep and extensive Craters, (some not less than a Mile in Circumference) have been formed by the late Eruption, and are visible on it's Flanks towards the Sea Side.
