7 HEREAS, in many of His Majesty's Vice-Admiralty Courts in the West Indies, Sentences of Condemnation have paffed against Ships and Goods belonging to the Subjects of the United States of America; and whereas, from Ignorance of the Rules respecting the Times of Appealing, or from Inability to find the Security required, or from other just and reafonable Impediments, the Claimants have been prevented from duly entering and profecuting their Appeals from the faid Sentences : And whereas it hath been reprefented to His Majefty, on their Behalf, that they are defirous of entering and profecuting the fame; His Majesty is thereupon pleafed, by and with the Advice of his Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the faid Parties shall be admitted to their respective Appeals, notwithstanding the ordinary Times for entering and profecuting the fame may have elapfed, provided the fame are entered and profecuted within a reafonable Time, to be approved by the Lords Commissioners of Appeals in Prize Caufes.

THE Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty having received repeated Reprefentations from the Captains of His Majesty's Ships employed as Convoys, that the Masters of Merchant Ships difobey their Sig-

nals and Instructions, and wilfully part Company without Leave, think it expedient to publish the following Section of an Act of Parliament passed in the Thirty-third Year of this prefent Majesty's Reign, intitled, " An Act for the Encouragement of Sea-" men, and for the better and more effectual Manning " His Majetty's Navy;" and do hereby give Notice that the fame will, upon any future Representations of the Nature abovementioned, be rigoroufly put in Force

Section 8. " And be it further enacted, that if " the Captain of any Merchant Ship under Convoy " shall wilfully difobey Signals or Instructions, or " any other lawful Commands of the Commander of " the Convoy, or shall defert the Convoy without " Notice given, and Leave obtained for that Purpose, he shall be liable to be articled against in the "High Court of Admiralty, at the Suit of the Crown, for Difobedience to the Orders of the Convoy, and, upon Conviction thereof, shall be " fined, at the Difcretion of the faid Court, in any " Sum not exceeding Five Hundred Pounds, and " shall further suffer Imprisonment, not exceeding One Year, as the faid Court shall adjudge." "

And to the End that Masters of Merchant Ships may not plead Ignorance, a Copy of the above Section will be printed at the Foot of the Convoy Instructions delivered to them.
