Admiralty-Office, August 23.

THE Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty having received repeated Representations from the Captains of His Majesty's Ships employed as Convoys, that the Masters of Merchant Ships disobey their Signals and Instructions, and wilfully part Company without Leave, think it expedient to publish the following Section of an Act of Parliament passed in the Thirty-third Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act for the Encouragement of Seamen, and for the better and more effectual Manning His Majesty's Navy;" and do hereby give Notice that the same will, upon any future Representations of the Nature abovementioned, be rigorously put in Force.

Section 8. "And be it further enacted, that if the Captain of any Merchant Ship under Convoy shall wilfully disobey Signals or Instructions, or any other lawful Commands of the Commander of the Convoy, or shall desert the Convoy without Notice given, and Leave obtained for that Purpose, he shall be liable to be articted against in the High Court of Admiralty, at the Suit of the Crown, for Disobedience to the Orders of the Convoy, and, upon Conviction thereof, shall be fined, at the Discretion of the said Court, in any Sum not exceeding Five Hundred Pounds, and shall further suffer Imprisonment, not exceeding One Year, as the said Court shall adjudge."

And to the End that Masters of Merchant Ships may not plead Ignorance, a Copy of the above Section will be printed at the Foot of the Convoy Instructions delivered to them.
