R E S Б Т, N The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. 7HEREAS by an Act passed in the Thirtythird Year of His prefent Majesty's Reign, intituled, " An Act to amend an Act made in the " Thirty-first Year of the Reign of His prefent Ma-" jefty, intituled, An Act for regulating the Impor-" tation and Exportation of Corn, and the Payment " of the Duty on Foreign Corn imported, and of " the Bounty on British Corn exported," it is, amongst other Things, enacted, That it shall and may be lawful for His Majefty, His Heirs and Succeffors, and He and They is and are thereby authorized, with the Advice of His or Their Privy Council, at any Time when the General Average Price of any Sort of Corn or of Oatmeal, in England or Scotland respectively, taken as in the faid Acts passed in the Thirty-first and Thirty-third Years of His present Majesty's Reign, is directed, shall appear to be at or above the Price at or above which Foreign Corn, Meal or Flour of the fame Sort is allowed by Law to be imported from Ireland or the Province of Quebec, or the other British Colonies and Plantations in North America, at the first Low Duties fpecified in the Table marked E. in the faid Act paffed in the Thirty-first Year of His present Majesty's Reign, to prohibit generally, for a limited Time, the Exportation from England and Scotland refpectively, as the Cafe may be, of any fuch Sort of Corn or other Articles mentioned in the faid Acts;

[Price Thirteen-pence Halfpenny.]

Price of any Sort of Corn or of Oatineal, in England or Scotland respectively, taken as in the faid Acts passed in the Thirty-first and Thirty-third Years of His prefent Majesty's Reign, is directed; shall appear to be at or above the Price at or above which Foreign Corn, Meal or Flour of the fame Soft Is allowed by Law to be imported from any other Foreign Country at the first Low Duty specified in the faid Table marked E. to permit generally the Importation into England or Scotland refpectively, as the Cafe may be, or the taking out of Warehouse for Home Confumption, of any fuch Sort of Foreign Corns Meal or Flour, on Payment of the fecond Low Duty only; and no other ; and in the like Manner to recall fuch Prohibition or Permission, if Circumstances shall appear to to require : Provided always, that as often as the Importation of any Sort of Corn, Meal or Flour, on the Low Duties, shall be permitted by His Majefty, His Heirs or Successors, by and with the Advice of His or Their Privy Council, fuch Permiffion shall continue in Force for the Space of Three Months at least from the Date of the Order in Council made for that Purpole.

And whereas, in purfuance of the Powers vefted in His Majefty by the faid Act paffed in the Thirtythird Year of His prefent Majefty's Reign, His Majefty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, was pleafed, by His Order in Council bearing Date the 28th of August, 1793, to prohibit (under the Provisions, Regulations and Exceptions therein mentioned and referred to) until the 30th of November then then eafuing, the Exportation from any of the Ports of that Part of Great Britain called England of any Rye, Peafe, Beans, Barley, Beer or Bigg, or Oats, or any Meal, Flour, Malt, Bread or Bifcuit made thereof; and in like Manner to prohibit the Exportation from any Port or Place in that Part of Great Britain called Scotland of any Barley, Beer or Bigg, Peafe, Beans, or Oats, or any Meal, Flour, Bread or Biscuit made thereof; and also to declare and order, that from and after the Date of the faid Order, until the Thirtieth Day of November then enfuing, it should be lawful to import into any Port or Place in that Part of Great Britain called England, and to take out of Warehouse for Home Consumption, any Foreign Rye, Peafe, Beans, Barley, Beer or Bigg, Oats, or Oatmeal; and alfo to import into any Port or Place in that Part of Great Britain called Scotland, and to take out of Warehouse for Home Consumption, any Foreign Barley, Peafe, Oats and Oatmeal, on Payment of the fecond Low Duty only, mentioned in the faid Table marked E. and no other.

And whereas by an Order in Council dated the Twenty-feventh Day of November, 1793, and by another Order dated the Twenty-fixth Day of February, 1794, and by a Third Order in Council, dated the Eighteenth Day of June, 1794, the Prohibitions and Permificons in the faid Order of the Twenty-eighth Day of August, 1793, contained, with respect to certain of the faid Articles, were to continue and remain in Force until the First Day of October, 1794, in the Manner in the faid Three last mentioned Orders respectively prescribed and directed.

And whereas it appears, from the Returns received in the Week ended the Twentieth Day of September, 1794, that the General Average Prices of Rye, Peafe, Beans, Barley, Beer or Bigg, Oats and Oatmeal, in that Part of Great Britain called England, are above the Prices at which Foreign Rye, Peafe, Beans, Barley, Beer or Bigg, Oats and Oatmeal, are allowed by Law to be imported at the first Low Duty specified in the faid Table marked E.; His Majesty, therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, purfuant to the Powers given by the faid Act, hath thought fit to order, and it is hereby ordered, tha the Prohibition to export Rye, Peafe, Beans, Barley, Beer or Bigg, or Oats, or any Meal, Flour, Malt, Bread or Bifcuit made thereof, from any Port or Place in that Part of Great Britain called England, and every Provision respecting the faid Prohibition in the faid Order of the Twenty-eighth Day of August, 1793, foall be, and the fame is hereby revived, and fhall continue in Force until the First Day of February, 1795.

And whereas it appears, from the Returns received in the Month immediately preceding the Fifteenth Day of September, 1794, that the General Average Price of Oats, in that Part of Great Britain called Scotland, is above the Price at which Foreign Oats are allowed by Law to be imported at the first Low Duty specified in the faid Table marked E.; His Majesty, therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, purfuant to the Powers given by the faid Act, hath thought fit to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Prohibition to export Oats from any Port or Place in that Part of Great Britain called Scotland, and every Provifion, Regulation and Exception refpecting the faid Prohibition in the faid Order of the Twenty-eighth Day of August, 1793, shall be, and the same is hereby revived, and shall continue in Force until the First Day of February, 1795.

And His Majefty, by and with the Advice aforefaid, hath thought fit further to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Permiflion to import into any Port or Place in that Part of Great Britain called England, and to take out of Warehoufe, for Home Confumption, any Foreign Rye, Peafe, Beans, Burley, Beer or Bigg, Oats or Oatmeal, on Payment of the fecond Low Duty only, mentioned in the faid Table marked E. and no other, and every Provision and Regulation respecting the faid Importation in the faid Order of the Twenty-eighth Day of August, 1793, contained, shall be, and the fame is hereby revived, and shall continue in Force until the faid First Day of February, 1795.

And the Right Honorable the Lords Commiftioners of His Majefty's Treafury are to give the necessfary Directions herein accordingly.
