

A'T the Court at St. James's, the 5th of November, 1794,

s٠ Р R Ε E Ν Т, The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. TREREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Order in Council of the 7th of May laft, prohibiting the transporting into any Parts out of this Kingdom any Pot-Afh or Pearl-Afh (except as in the faid Order is mentioned) will expire upon the 7'h Day of this infant November : And whereas it is judged expedient that the faid Prohibition should be continued for fome Time longer; His Majefty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit and command, that no Perfon or Perfons whatfoever do, at any Time during the Space of Six Months from the Date of this Order in Council, export or attempt to export, transport, carry or convey, or lade or lay on Board of any Ship, Veffel or Boat, in order to be exported, transported, carried or conveyed out of this Kingdom, any Pot- 1sh or Pearl Afh, without Leave or Permiftion bei: g first had and obtained from His Majesty or His Fries Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by an Act passed in the last Seffion of Parliament, intituled, " An Act for in-** demnifying all Perfons who have been concerned " in advising or carrying into Execution an Order " of the Lords Commiffioners of His Majefty's ** Treasury respecting the Exportation of Pot Ashes " or Pearl-Ashes; for preventing Suits in con-" 'equence of the fame; for authorizing His Ma-" jefty to prohibit the Exportation or carrying " Coattwife of Pot-Alles or Pearl-Athes, and for " naking further Provisions relative thereto." But it is neverthelefs His Majefly's Pleafure that

nothing herein contained shall exterd, or be conflrued to extend, to the Exportation of the faid Articles to Ireland, or to His Majerty's Iflands of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark or Man, or to His Majefty's Colonies or Plantations in America or the West Indics, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majefly's Forts and Settlements on the Coaft of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the Blitish Settlements or Factories in the East Indies ; provided that, upon the Exportation of the faid Articles to Ireland, or to His Majefty's Iflands of Guernley, Jerley, Alderney, Sark of Man, or to His Majesty's Colonies and Plantatious in America or the Weft Indies, or to the Island of Newfoundland, or to His Majefly's Forts and Settlements on the Coaft of Africa, or to the Ifland of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies, the Exporters of the faid Articles do first make Oath of the true Deflination of the fame to the Places for which they shall be entered Outwards, before the Entry of the fame fhall be made, and do give full and fofEcient Security, by Bond, to the Satisfaction of the Commiftioners of His Majetty's Cultoms, to carry the faid Articles to the Places for which they are fo entered Outwards, and none other : and fuch Bond fhall not be cancelled or delivered up until Proof be made, to the Satisfaction of the daid Commiffioners, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the faid Comm Inners, and fpecified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in fuch "and Minner as shall be directed by the faid Commissioners, shewing that the feid Articles have been duly landed at the Places for which they were e t - d Outwards. Horfe Guards, November 8.

BY Difpatches this Morning received from His Royal Highnets the Duke of York, dated Arnheim, the 28th of October and 1st and 4th of November, 1794, it appears, that the Enemy, on the 27th Ult. made an Attack on the British Out-Posts in Front of Nimeguen, which were driven in ; a new Polition was in confequence taken up oppolite to the Left of the Town, against which a heavy Fire has fince been kept up by the French, who, the fame Evening, attacked the Out-Posts of Fort St. André twhich fell back to the Fort. Lieutenant-General Aber-crombie and Lieutenant-Colonel Sir William Clarke were flightly wounded in this Skirmish, and Captain Picton, of the 12th Regiment, was also wounded, in a Sally made from Nimeguen on the Morning of the 23th. On the 1st of November the Enemy broke Ground, but it does not appear that they have fince made any confiderable Progrefs in the Siege. The fame Dispatches mention that Venlo surrendered on the 28th. The Garrison is allowed to march out with the Honours of War, and Ten Pieces of Cannon; and is not restrained from ferving again. Coblentz has been in the Possession of the French since the 21st Ult.

Horfe-Guards, November 8.

BY a Difpatch which has been received from Major-General Williamfon, dated Jamaica the 1ft of September, 1794, it appears, that the Persons to whom the Defence of the Post of Petite Riviere, in the Island of St. Domingo, had been entrusted by General La Vaux, Commander in Chief of the Troops of the Convention in that Island, made an Offer to Lieutenant-Colonel Brifbane, commanding His Majesty's Forces at St. Marc, to place the Post of the Petite Riviere, with the Parish of that Name, and the adjacent Plain of Artinobite, under His Ma-jefty's Authority. This Offer was accepted by Lieutenant-Colonel Brifbane, and a Capitulation to this Effect was figned on the 19th of August, 1794. The Terms of this Capitulation, and the Means by which it was effectuated, were concerted with M. De Villanuova, commanding the Forces of His Catho-lick Majefty in that Part of the Ifland, who appears, on this Occasion, and in the Execution of some Military Operations which had previoufly taken Place, to have co-operated in the most cordial and friendly Manner with His Majefty's Forces.

William Elphinftone, Thomas Pattle, Elq; David Scott, Elq; Thomas Theophilus Metcalfe, Elq; William Money, Elq; Stephen Williams, Elq; Walter Ewer, Elq; Simon Frafer, Elq; and Charles Grant, Elq; beitg introduced by the Lord of His Majeity's Bedchauber in Waiting: Which Addrefs His Majefty was pleafed to receive very gracioufly.

To the KING's Most Excellent Majesty.

WE, your Majesty's loyal Subjects, the United Company of Merchants of England trading to the East Indies, beg Leave, in this arduous Crisis, to express our Sentiments of zealous Attachment to your Majefty's Royal Perfon, Family and Govern-ment. When Principles, equally deftructive to the Rights of private Property, and to all Establishments, religious and political, are avowed and acted upon by a populous and powerful Nation in the Centre of Europe, we confider it as a Duty incumbent on all your Majesty's Subjects, but particularly on great Commercial Societies, posselling and employing large Capitals in the Circulation of Trade, to express in the most decided Terms, a Detestation of fuch a System of Warfare, which is without Example in the Hiftory of the civilized World; and at the fame Time we declare that we will, as Individuals, in common with our Fellow Subjects, chearfully fultain the extraordinary Burthens which a War, fo extensive in it's Operations and fo important in it's Confequences, may require.

The Constitution of our Country has been fully tried, and we have every Reafon to be facisfied with the Principles on which it is founded : The Comfort and Happinels enjoyed by all Claffes of your Ma-jefty's Subjects, are Proofs of it's Wildom and Efficacy; and the public Power of the Country equally demonstrates it's Superiority over every other known Government in the World. Having these Sentiments strongly impressed on our Minds, we pledge ourselves to support your Majesty's Government and the Constitution, with our Lives and Fortunes, against the Foreign Enemy; and the fame Sentiments will prompt us to every active Exertion necessary for the Suppression of Domestic Tumults. In all Communities there will be Faction and Difcontent; but the Subjects of your Majefty's Government are fo fecure in Property and perfonal Liberty, that amongst them Faction against the Law and Constitution can originate only in Wickedness or Folly. Anxious as we naturally are to fee the Peace of Europe reflored, we are fully perfuaded that active and vigorous Exertions for the Profecution of the War are the only effectual Means to obtain it, on fafe and honorable Terms. As a small but earnest Testimony of our Zeal to support your Majesty's Government, the Conftitution of the Country, and the Rights of Society, grofsly violated by the Principles and Prac-tices of the common Eueny of Europe, we beg Leave to submit to your Majesty our Wish to raise and clothe Three Regiments of Infantry, at the Ex-pence of this Company, to confift of One Thousand Men each, for the eventual Service of the Company in India; but to remain, during the prefent War, at the Difpofal of your Majefly's Government, to ferve in Great Britain or Ireland, or the Iflands of Jerfey, Guernfey, Alderney and Sark. And we beg Leave to request that the Officers belonging to our And we beg Military

Military Ettablishments in India, now in Europe, may be employed in those Regiments, subject to your Majefty's Royal Approbation.
