A PROCLAMATION,

THEREAS Our Parliament stands prorogued to Tuesday the Twenty-fifth Day of this instant November; We, with the Advice of Our Privy Council, do hereby publish and declare, That the faid Parliament shall be further prorogued, on the faid Twenty-fifth Day of November, to Tuesday the Thirtieth Day of December, One thousand seven hundred and ninety-four : And We have given Order to Our Chancellor of Great Britain to prepare a Commission for proroguing the same accordingly: And We do hereby further declare Our Royal Will and Pleasure, That the said Parliament shall, on the faid Thirtieth Day of December, One thousand seven hundred and ninety-four, be held for the Dispatch of divers weighty and important Affairs: And the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens and Burgesses, and the Commissioners for Shires and Burghs of the House of Commons, are hereby required to give Attendance accordingly at Westminster, on the said Thirtieth Day of Decemiber, One thousand seven hundred and ninety-four.

Given at Our Court at St. James's, the Nineteenth Day of November, One thousand seven hundred and ninety four, in the Thirty fifth Year of Our Reign.

This Day a Treaty of Amity, Commerce and Navigation between His Majesty and the United States of America was signed by the Right Honourable Lord Grenville, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Assairs, being duly authorized for that Purpose on His Majesty's Part, and the Honourable John Jay, Envoy Extraordinary from the United States of America, having a like Authority on the Part of the said States.

Dispatch, of which the following is an Extract, dated Arnheim, the 11th of November, 1794, has been received from his Royal Highness the Duke of York by the Right Honorable Henry Dundas, One of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State.

THE Evacuation of Nimeguen took Place on Friday Night. His Majesty's Troops retired without any Loss; which would also have been the Case with the Dutch, but for an unfortunate chance Shot, which carried away the Top of the Malt of the Flying Bridge to which the Hawfer was made fast, consequently the Bridge swung round, and they were taken Prisoners, to the Amount of about Four Hundred. The Bridge of Boats was entirely burnt, and the Flying Bridge, of which they got Possession by the above Accident, has been fince destroyed by
