BILLS of EXCHANGE and NOTES.

Stamp-Office, Somerset-Place,
September 11, 1794.

WHEREAS by an Act of the last Session of Parliament, Cap. 32, the Legislature has thought it expedient to give Relief to such Persons as may be the bona fide Holders of Bills of Exchange, Promissory or other Notes, Drafts, or Orders, written by the Drawers, with Intent to defraud or impose, upon Paper not stamped, or if stamped, not of the proper Denomination or Value, whereby the Holders of these Securities are prevented from recovering their just Demands, by reason that the same, not being stamped in pursuance of the Act of the Thirty-first Year of His present Majesty, Cap. 25, cannot be given in Evidence in any of His Majesty's Courts: Notice is hereby given to the Holders of the Bills, Notes, Drafts, or Orders abovementioned, on the 1st Day of January, 1794, that, upon producing the same to His Majesty's Commissioners of the Stamp Duties at any Time, during Office Hours, before the 1st Day of January, 1795, and then fully answering, UPON OATH OR SOLEMN AFFIRMATION, all lawful Questions relating to such Securities, to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners, they will direct their Officers, upon Payment of the proper Duty, and the Sum of Ten Pounds over and above the said Duty, for each, to stamp the same.

East India House, November 12, 1794.

WHEREAS the United Company of Merchants of England trading to the East Indies have humbly requested His Majesty's Permission for Raising and Clothing Three Regiments of Infantry, to consist of One Thousand Men each, for the eventual Service of the Company in India, but to remain, during the present War, at the Disposal of His Majesty's Government, to serve in Great Britain or Ireland, or in the Islands of Jersey, Guernsey, Alderney or Sark; and have also requested His Majesty's Permission, that the Officers belonging to the Company's Military Establishment in India, now in Europe, may be employed in those Regiments, subject to His Majesty's Royal Approbation; and His Majesty having been graciously pleased to grant the Company's Request; Notice is hereby given to the Officers of the Company's Service now in England on Leave of absence, who are desirous of serving in those Regiments, that they are to signify their Desire to the Court of Directors, as early as possible before the 3d Day of December next.
