A T the Court at St. James's, the 12th of November, 1794,

PRESENT, 'The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. HEREAS by an Act of Parliament paffed in the Twenty-fixth Year of His late Majesty's Reign, intituled, " An Act to oblige Ehips more effectually to perform their Quarantine, s and for the better preventing the Plague being " brought from Foreign Parts into Great Britain ... or Ireland, or the Islands of Guernsley, Jersey, " Alderney, Sark or Man," it is, among many other Things, enacted, That all Ships and Veffels arriving, and all Perfons, Goods and Merchandizes whatfoever, coming or imported into any Port or Place within Great Britain, or any of the Ifles beforementioned, from any Place from whence His Majefty His Heirs or Succeffors, by and with the Advice of His or Their Privy Council, shall judge it probable that the Infection may be brought, fhall be obliged to make their Quarantine in fuch Place and Places, for fuch Time, and in fuch Manner, as has been or thall, from Time to Time, be directed by His Majefly, His Heirs or Succeffors, by His or Their Order or Orders, made in His or Their Privy Council, and notified by Proclamation, or published in the London Gazette; and that until fuch Ships, Veffels, Perfons, Goods and Merchandizes thall have respectively performed and be discharged from such Quarantine, no fuch Perfon, Goeds or Merchandizes, or any of them, shall come or be brought on Shore, or go or be put on board any other Ship or Veffel, in any Place within His Majefty's Dominions, unless in fuch Manner, and in fuch Cafes, and by

fuch Licence, as shall be directed or permitted by fach Order or Orders made by His Majefty, His Heirs or Succeffors, in Council as aforefaid; and that all fuch Ships and Veffels, and the Perfons or Goods coming or imported in, or going or being put on board the fame, and all Ships, Veffels, Boats and Perfons receiving any Goods or Perfons out of the fame, shall be fubject to fuch Orders, Rules and Directions concerning Quarantine, and the Prevention of Infection, as have been or shall be made by His Majefty, His Heirs and Succeffors, in Council, and notified by Proclamation or publisted in the London Gazette as aforementioned, under fuch Pains and Penalties as are inflicted by the faid Act.

And whereas Information has been received that a Fever, which is fimilar in it's Symptoms and Mortality to the malignant and contagious Fever, of the Nature of the Plague, which prevailed laft Year in Philadelphia, in the State of Penfylvania, has manifelled itfelf at Baltimore in the State of Maryland; His Majefty, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, judging it probable that the Infection may be brought into this Kingdom from Baltimore, or fome other Port or Place in the faid Stare of Maryland, doth thereupon deem it expedient, for the Safety of the Publick Health, to order, and it is hereby ordered, That all Ships, Vessels, Perfons, Goods and Merchandize now arrived, or that shall hereafter arrive in any Port of this Kingdom, or the Ifles of Guernfey, Jerfey, Alderney, Sark or Man, from Baltimore or any other Port or Place in the faid State of Maryland, do make their Quarantine for Fourteen Days, which is to commence and be computed from the Day

Day each Ship or Veffel shall come to Anchor in the Place appointed for the Performance of Quarantine, and not before.

That the Places herein after named fhall be and are hereby appointed to be the Places wherein fuch Ships or Vessels (not having the Infection on board) shall respectively perform Quarantine; that is to fay: All Ships or Vefiels which are or shall, be bound to the Port of London, or any Member, Creek, or other Parts thercof, or to the River Thames or Medway, shall perform their Quarantine in Standgate Creek ; all Ships or Veffels which are or shall be bound to the Ports of Jpfwich, Yarmouth, Lynn, Boston, Hull, Newcastle or Berwick upon Tweed, or any of them, or any Member or Creek thercof, or other Place therein, shall perform their Quarantine in Whitebooth Road, between Hull and Grimiby; all Ships or Veffels which are or shall be bound to the Ports of Carlifle and Chefler, or either of them, or any Member or Creek thereof, or other Place therein, or to any l'art of the Isle of Man, shall perform their Quatantine in a Place called Highlake, near Liverpool, at the Well End thereof; all Ships or Vocels which are or fhall be bound to the Ports of Milford, Cardiff, Gloucofter, Briftol, Bridgwater, or any of them, or any Member or Creek of them, or any of them, or to FadRow or St. Ive's, being Members of the Port of Plymouth, or to Ilfracombe or Barnfleple, being Members of the Port of Exeter, or to any other Place within the fuid Ports of Millo d, Cardiff, Gloucester, Briftol or | Bridgwater, or within the faid Members or Creeks, shall perform their Quarantine in Kingroad and Perfiate Pill, all Ships or Veffels which are or Veffel obliged to perform Quarantine, in order to shall be bound to the Port of Plymouth, except conduct the same into any Port or Place, but shall fuch Pa :, thereof as have been herein before mentioned, or to the Port of Exeter, except fuch Parts thereof as have been herein before mentioned, or to the Post of Pool, or any of the Members or Creeks or other Flaces within the faid Ports of Plymouth, Exciter and Rool, except as before excepted, or to Falm ach, a Member of the Fort of Plymouth, or any Greek thereof, or any other Place therein, shall perform their Quarantine in a Place called St. Ive's Pool, within the Moath of the Harbour of Falmouth; all Ships or Vefiels which are or fhall be bound to the Posts of Southampton, Chichefter, Sandwich, or any of them, or any of the Members or Creeks thereof, or of any of them, or any other Place within the fame, fhall perform their Quarantine at a Place called the Mother Bank, near Portfmouth; all Ships or Veffels which are or Grograin or Mohair Yarn, Human Hair, Goats shall be bound to the Eastern Coast of Scotland. comprehending the Ports of Leith, Borrowstoness, Ailoa Dunbar, Kirkaldy, Anstruther, Prefton-Pans, Dundee, Perth, Montrofe and Aberdeen, or to an Member, Creek or other Parts thercof, shall per.

form their Quarantine in Inverkeithing Bay; 'all Ships or Veffels which are or fhall be bound to the Weltern Ports of Scotland, comprehending the Ports of Port Glefgow, Greenock, Irvine, Campbelioun, Oban, Rothfay, Fort William, Air, Port Patrick, Stranzaer and Wigtoun, or to any Member, Cre.k or other Parts thereof, shall perform their Quarantine at Laulash in the Island of Arran; all Ships or Veffels which are or fhall be bound to the Northern Ports of Scotland, comprehending the Ports of Invernefs, Zetland, Orkney, Caithnels and Stornaway, or to any Member, Creek or other Parts thereof, shall perform their Quarantine in Cromarty Bay in the Murray Firth; all Ships or Veffels which are or fhall be bound to the South-Weft Ports of Scotland, comprehending the Ports of Dumfries and Kirkcudbright, or to any Member, Creek or other Parts thereof, shall perform their Quarantine at Carsthorn, at the Mouth of the River Nith; all Ships or Veffels which are or shall be bound to the Isle of Jerfey, or any Part thereof, shall perform their Quarantine at a certain Place on the Coaft of the faid Ifland, called Belle-Croute, or at some Place herein before appointed for Performance of Quarantine on the Coaft of England; and all Ships or Veffels which are or fhall be bound to the Islands of Guernfey, Sark or Alderney, or either of them, or any Part of them, or any of them, shall perform their Quarantine in a Place near the Island of Guernfey, called the Little Road, or at fome Place berein before appointed for Performance of Quarantine on the Coaft of England.

That no Pilot faall go on board any Ship or perform fuch Service in fome other Boat or Veilel, which Boat or Veffel fl.all keep as much to the Windward of the Ship or Veffel fo to be conducted as possible; and if any Pilot or other Perfon shall go on board fach Ship or Veficl, fuch Pilot or other Person shall perform Quarantine, in like Manner as any Perfon coming in fuch Ship or Veficl thall be obliged to perform the fame.

That all Goods, Wares and Merchandizes liable to Quarantine as aforesaid, fiall he opened, unpacked and aired, unlefs His Majefty fhall think fit, by His Order in Council, to direct otherwife, and fo remain a Week, other than Hemp and Flax, Paper or Books, Silk raw, thrown or wrought, Linen, Cotton-Wool, Cotton-Yarn or manufactured, Wool raw or any wife wrought, Feathers, Hair, Carmenia Wool, Carpets, Camblets, Burdets, or other Manufactures of Silk and Cotton, Kid-Skins, and Skins in the Wool or Heir, Spunges, Vine and Oil in Chefts, Thread Stockings, all Goods packed with Straw or Cotton, Straw Hats and

> That the Captains of every of His MajeRy's Ships of War, who shall meet any such Ship or Veffel coming to any of the Forts of Great Britain, or of the Ifles of Guernfey, Jerfey, Alderney, Sark or Man, fasll take due Care to prevent the landing any Goods, Seamen or Paffengers from on Board the fame, until they fiall Le put under the Direction of the Officers of his Elejeky's Cuftoms.

> That the Commissioners and other Office's of His Mejefty's Cuftoms do use their utmost Dillgence and Care that the Quarantine before directed be duly performed.

General Post-Office, November 24, 1794.

THE Post-Boy carrying the Cross Post Mail from Warminster to Salifbury, containing the Bags from Briftol, Baib, Frome, Warminfter, and Heytesbury, for Salifbury, Winchefter, Southampton and Portfmouth, on Friday Night the 21st Instant, was stopt about Eleven O'Clock, between Langford and Stapleford, by a Man on Horfeback, who tisd the Boy's Hands and Legs, and robbed the Mail by breaking open many of the Bags, and taking out the Contents of various Letters. He alfo took from the Boy a dun-coloured Gelding, about Fourteen Hands bigh, with broken Knees, leaving his own Horfe behind him, which is a dark Bay or Brown Gal-loway, Thirteen Hands and a Half high, a finall Star in his Forebead, and a neat Saddle and Curb Bridle.

The Perfon who committed this Robbery is described to be a short thick Man, dreffed in a Smock Frock. From bis Appearance, Expressions and Conduct, he is supposed to be the fame Man who robbed the fame Mail in June laft, near to the Place where this Robbery was committed.

Whoever shall apprehend and convict, or cause to be apprehended and convicted, the Person who committed this Robbery, will be entitled to a Reward of TWO HUNDRED POUNDS, over and above the Reward given by A& of Parliament for apprehending of High-waymen; or if any Perfon, whether an Accomplice in the Robbery, or knowing thereof, shall surrender himself and make Discovery, whereby the Person who committed the fame muy be apprehended and brought to Justice, fuch Discoverer will, upon Conviction of the Party, be entitled to the fame Reward, and will also receive His Maiene. Majefty's most gracious Pardon.
