fore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, purfuant to the Powers given by the faid Act paffed in the Thirty-third Year of His Majesty's Reign, hath thought fit to order, and it is hereby ordered, that from and after the Date of this prefent Order until the Third Day of June, 1795, or until fuch Time as His Majefty shall think fit to revoke this prefent Order, no Perfon or Perfons whatfoever shall, directly or indirectly, export, transport, carry or convey, or caufe or procure to be exported, tranfported, carried or conveyed out of or from any Port or Place in that Part of Great Britain called England, or load or lay on board, or caufe or procure to be loaded or laid on board of any Ship, Veffel or Boat, in order to be exported or carried out of any Port or Place in that Part of Great Britain called England, any Wheat, or any Meal, Flour, Malt, Bread or Biscuit made thereof.

His Majesty, nevertheless, by the Advice aforesaid, hath thought fit to order, and it is hereby ordered, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be conftrued to extend, to prohibit the Exportation from England of any Foreign Wheat that shall have been imported, and shall be warehoused in Manner and on the Conditions mentioned in the faid A& paffed in the Thirty-first Year of His prefent Majesty's Reign, nor to prevent the carrying Coastwife (except as is hereinafter excepted) or carrying out, or the Exportation of Wheat, or the other Articles as aforefaid, from England, for any of the Purpoles mentioned in either of the faid Two Acts, in like Manner, and in the fame Proportions and Quantities, and from and to the fame Ports and Places, as is by faid Acts allowed, at fuch Times as Wheat or theother Articles before mentioned are prohibited to be exported, by reafon of the Price of Wheat being at or above the Price mentioned in Table B. in the faid Act, passed in the Thirty-first Year of His prefent Majesty's Reign, contained, fubject to the like Securities, Conditions, Regulations and Reffrictions, Forfeitures and Penalties, as are in either of the faid Two Acts, or by any other Act now in Force, in any fuch Cafe, required and imposed; nor to prohibit the Exportation of fuch Wheat or other Articles as aforefaid, which shall have been entered Outwards, and shall have been actually shipped or laden on board, or fo much thereof, expressed in such Entry, as shall have been fo shipped or laden on board, at the Time of the Date of this prefent Order, in the fame Manner as if this Prohibition to export had not been made.

Provided, nevertheles, that any fuch Wheat or other Articles as aforefaid fhall not be permitted to

be carried Coaftwife, or to be otherwife carried from any Port from which the Exportation thereof is not, at the Time of fhipping the fame, allowed by Law, and be landed and unfhipped at any other Port in Great Britain from which the fame may then be legally exported.

And His Majefty, by and with the Advice aforefaid, hath thought fit further to order, and it is hereby ordered, that from and after the Date of this prefent Order until the Third Day of June, 1795, it fhall be lawful to import into any Port or Place in that Part of Great Britain called England, and to take out of Warehoufe, for Home Confumption, any Foreign Wheat, Wheat-Meal or Flour, on Payment of the fecond Low Duty only, mentioned in the faid Table marked E. and no other.

And the Right Honorable the Lords Commiffioners of His Majefty's Treatury are to give the neceffary Directions herein accordingly.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. 7HEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Order in Council of the 18th of June laft, for prohibiting the Exportation out of this Kingdom, or carrying Coastwife, Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, will expire upon the 7th Day of this inftant December: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majefty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the faid Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer; His Majefty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy. Council, hereby order, require, prohibit and command, that no Perfon or Perfons whatfoever (except the Mafter-General of the Ordnance for His Majesty's Service) do, at any T'me during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the faid 7th Day of this inflant December, prefume to transport, into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coastwife, any Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, of thip or lade any Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, on board any Ship or Veffel, in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, or carrying the fame Coastwife, without Leave or Permission in that Behalf first obtained from His Majefty, or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring and fuffering the respective. Forfeitures and Penalties inflicted by an Act paffed in the Twenty-ninth Year of His late Majefty's Reign, intituled,
