England of any Foreign Wheat that shall have been imported, and shall be warehoused in Manner and on the Conditions mentioned in the faid Act passed in the Thirty-first Year of His present Majesty's Reign, nor to prevent the carrying Coastwife (except as is hereinafter excepted) or carrying out, or the Exportation of Wheat, or the other Articles as afore faid, from England, for any of the Purposes mentioned in either of the faid Two Acts, in like Manner, and in the same Proportions and Quantities, and from and to the fame Ports and Places, as is by faid Acts allowed, at fuch Times as Wheat or theother Articles before mentioned are prohibited to be exported, by reafon of the Price of Wheat being at or above the Price mentioned in Table B. in the said Act, passed in the Thirty-first Year of His present Maiesty's Reign, contained, subject to the like Securities, Conditions, Regulations and Restrictions, . Forfeitures and Penalties, as are in either of the faid Two Acts, or by any other Act now in Force, in any fuch Case, required and imposed; nor to prohibit the Exportation of fuch Wheat or other Articles as aforefaid, which shall have been entered Outwards, and thall have been actually shipped or laden on board, or so much thereof, expressed in such Entry, as shall have been so shipped or laden on board, at the Time of the Date of this present Order, in the same Manner as if this Prohibition to export had not been made.

Provided, nevertheless, that any such Wheat or other Articles as aforesaid shall not be permitted to be carried Coastwise, or to be otherwise carried from any Port from which the Exportation thereof is not, at the Time of shipping the same, allowed by Law, and be landed and unshipped at any other Port in Great Britain from which the same may then be legally exported.

And His Majesty, by and with the Advice afore-said, hath thought fit further to order, and it is thereby ordered, that from and after the Date of this present Order until the Third Day of June, 1795, it shall be lawful to import into any Port or Place in that Part of Great Britain called England, and to take out of Warehouse, for Home Consumption, any Foreign Wheat, Wheat-Meal or Flour, on Payament of the second Low Duty only, mentioned in the said Table marked E. and no other.

And the Right Honorable the Lords Commifdioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary Directions herein accordingly.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. 7HEREAS the Time limited by His Maiestv's Order in Council of the 18th of June last, for prohibiting the Exportation out of this Kingdom, or carrying Coastwise, Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, will expire upon the 7th Day of this instant December: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the faid Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer; His Majesty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit and command, that no Person or Persons whatsoever (except the Master-General of the Ordnance for His Majesty's Service) do, at any Time during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the faid 7th Day of this instant December, prefume to transport, into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coastwise, any Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or ship or lade any Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Surt of Arms or Ammunition, on board any Ship or Vessel, in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, or carrying the same Coastwise, without Leave or Permission in that Behalf first obtained from His Majesty, or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring and fuffering the respective Forfeitures and Penalties inflicted by an Act passed in the Twenty-ninth Year of His late Majesty's Reign, intituled, " An Act to impower His Majesty to pro-" hibit the Exportation of Salt-Petre, and to enforce " the Law for impowering His Majesty to prohibit " the Exportation of Gunpowder, or any Sort of " Arms or Ammunition; and also to empower His " Majesty to restrain the carrying Coastwife of Salt-" Petre, Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Am-"munition:"-And the Lords Commissioners of His Majely's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General of the Ordnance, and His Majesty's Secretary at War, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.
