At the General Session of the Peace of our Lord the King, holden for the City of London, at Justice Hall in the Old Bailey, within the Parish of St. Sepulchre in the Ward of Farringdon Without, in London aforesaid, on Monday the Eighth Day of December, in the Thirty-fifth Year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord George the Third, King of Great Britain, &c. before Thomas Skinner, Esq; Mayor of the City of London, Sir Watkin Lewes, Knt. John Boydell, Esq; Paul Le Meunier, Esq; Aldermen of the said City, Sir John William Rose, Knt. Serjeant at Law, Recorder of the said City, William Curtis, Esq; John William Anderson, Esq; William Staines, Esq; other of the Aldermen of the said City, and others their Fellows, Justices of our said Lord the King, assigned to keep the Peace of our said Lord the King within the said City, and also to hear and determine divers Felonies, Trespases and other Misdemeanors committed within the said City;
