**H**IS Majesty having been pleased to appoint John Earl of Bute to be Lord-Lieutenant of the County of Glamorgan, his Lordship this Day took the Oaths appointed to be taken thereupon, instead of the Oaths of Allegiance and Supremacy.

The King has been pleased to grant to George Bellas, of Pembroke Hall in the University of Cambridge, Esq; His Royal Licence and Authority that he and his Issue may assume and take the Surname and Arms of Greenhough, quarterly with those of Bellas, pursuant to the Will of his maternal Grandfather Thomas Greenhough, late of Bedford-Square, Esq; deceased; such Arms being first duly exemplified according to the Laws of Arms, and recorded in the Heralds Office: And also to order that this His Majesty's Concession and Declaration be registered in His College of Arms.

**S**EVERAL Persons whose Names are thereunto subscribed, on Behalf of themselves and others, being legal Electors to serve in Parliament for the Town and Port of Seaford in the County of Sussex, having this Day presented their Petition to the House of Commons, setting forth, that, upon the 19th Day of March, 1792, the Select

Committee, who were appointed to try and determine the Merits of a Petition of Sir Godfrey Webster, Baronet, and John Farleton, Esquire, against the Return of Members to serve in Parliament for the said Town and Port of Seaford, reported to the House that they had determined, "That the Right of Election is in the Inhabitants, Housekeepers of the said Town and Port, paying Scot and Lot, and "in such Inhabitants Housekeepers only." That the Petitioners are advised that the said Right of Election so determined by the said Select Committee is not the Right of Election for the said Town and Port; therefore, and to prevent the said Judgment of the said Select Committee from becoming final and conclusive, pray, that they may be admitted as Parties, according to the Form of the Statute in that Case lately made and provided, to oppose the said Right of Election in Favour of which the said Select Committee have reported as aforesaid, and that they may have such other Relief in the Premises as to the House shall seem meet, and the Nature of the Case may require. I do hereby give Notice, that the House has appointed Tuesday the Tenth Day of February next, at Three o'Clock in the Afternoon, to take the said Petition into Consideration.
