contemn and neglect the Performance of so religious and necessary a Duty. Our Will is therefore, and We charge, That this Our Proclamation seen, ye forthwith pass to the Market-Cross of Edinburgh, and all other Places needful, and there, in Our Name and Authority, make Publication hereof, that none pretend Ignorance: And Our Will and Pleasure is, That Our Solicitor do cause printed Copies hereof to be fent to the Sheriffs of the feveral Shires, Stewarts of Stewartries, and Bailiffs of Regalities, and their Clerks, whom We ordain to fee the same published; and We appoint them to fend Copies hereof to the feveral Parish Churches within their Bounds, that upon the Lord's Day immediately preeeding the Day above-mentioned, the fame may be published, and read from the Pulpits, immediately after Divine Service.

Risk and Expence of the said Proprietors, there to remain in safe Custody, for the Benefit of the Proprietors thereof, until due Provision shall be made by Law to enable such Proprietors to re-export, or otherwise dispose of the same. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary Directions herein accordingly.

X7HEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council-of the Sixteenth of July last, prohibiting the transporting into any Parts out of this Kingdom any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rosin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, will expire upon the Twenty-fifth Day of this instant January; and whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the faid Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer: His Majesty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit and command, that no Person or Persons whosoever Time, for the Space of Six Months, to do at commence from the faid Twenty-fifth Day of this inflant January, prefume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, any Pig Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rofin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores; or ship or lade any of the Articles above mentioned on board any Ship or Vessel, in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, without Leave or Permission being first had and obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by an Act, passed in the Thirty-third Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act to ena-" ble His Majesty to restrain the Exportation of Na-" val Stores, and more effectually to prevent the Ex-" portation of Salt-Petre, Arms and Ammunition, " when prohibited by Proclamation or Order in " Council." But it is, nevertheless, His Majesty's Pleasure, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be confirmed to extend, to any of His Majesty's Ships of War, or any other Ships or Vessels or Boats, in the Service of His Majesty, or employed or freighted by His Majesty's Beard of Ordnance, or by the Commissioners of His Ma-

effy's Navy; nor to prevent any Ship or Vessel from taking or having on Board such Quantities of Naval Stores as may be necessary for the Use of fuch Ship or Vessel during the Course of her intended Voyage, or by Licence from the Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, or the Commissioners of the Admiralty for the Time being; nor to the Exportation of the said several Aticles to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Yards or Garrisons, or to His Majesty's Colonies or Plantations in America, or. the West Indies, or to Newsoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa; or to the Island of St. Helena, or the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies; provided that, upon the Exportation of any of the faid Articles, for the Purpoles of Trade, to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Yards or Garrisons, or to His Majesty's Colonies and Plantations in America, or the West Indies, or to the Island of Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies, the Exporters of such Articles do first make Oath of the true Destination of the same to the Places for which they shall be entered Outwards, before the Entry of the same shall be made, and do give full and fufficient Security by Bond, to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, to carry the faid Articles to the Places for which they are fo entered Outwards, and for the Purpofes specified, and none other; and fuch Bond shall not be cancelled or delivered up, until Proof be made, to the Satisfac. tion of the faid Commissioners, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the faid Commifsioners, and specified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in such Form and Manner as shall be directed by the faid Commissioners, shewing that the faid Articles have been duly landed at the Places for which they were entered Outwards. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

SECTION XVII. And whereas great Losses and

long Time has elapfed after the Monies were issued to them, be it enacted, That the Paymaster-General of His Majesty's Forces, the Treasurer of the Navy, the Treasurer of the Ordnance, and every other Public Officer who shall hereaster pay into the Hands of any Person or Persons whomsoever, Meney for Public Services, by Way of Imprest or ou Account, shall, within Thirty Days of the 31st Day of December, One thousand seven hundred and eighty sive, and within Thirty Days of the 31st Day of December in every suture Year, transmit an Account of all Sums of Money issued or paid by him or them to any Person or Persons, for the Public Service, within the preceding Year, to the Commissioners to be appointed under the Authority of this Act; who shall, and they are hereby required forthwith to transsmit Duplicates of the same to His Majesty's Remembrancer in the Court of Exchequer, who shall immediately, on Receipt of such Accounts, put the several Sums so issued in Charge against the Parties, in like Manner as is now practifed with respect to Persons who receive Money by Way of Imprest, and on Account, at the Receipt of His Majesty's Exchequer.

SECTION XVIII. Provided always, and be it enacted, That no Accountant shall be allowed in his Account any Sum which he shall issue or pay over to any Sub-Accountants, unless he shall have transmitted to the said Commissioners regular Accounts thereof, in the Manner and within the Times abovementioned; unless Proof shall be produced, to the Satisfaction of the Lord High Treasurer, or the Commissioners of the Treasury, that any Failure of transmitting the same did not happen from the wilful Neglect of the Person sections of

iffuing or paying over the Money as aforesaid.

Section XX. And be it surther enacted and declared, That every Sub-Accountant to whom Money shall hereafter be issued for Public Services, in case the Money so issued shall have been for Services to be performed in Great Britain, shall deliver into the Office of the Commissioners to be appointed by virtue of this Act, the Vouchers for the Expenditure thereof, together with an Account Current, within Three Months of the End of each Year from the Commencement of his Account, unies it has been usual for such Account to be made up to any fixed Period in the Year; in which Case they shall be delivered within Three Months of the usual annual Time of the Determination of fuch Account respectively; and in case such Monies shall have been issued for Services to be performed an any Part of Europe out of this Kingdom, then the Vouchers shall be delivered within Four Months of the Expiration of each Year's Accounts; if in the West Indies, the Continent of America, or in Africa, within Six Months after the Expiration of each Year's Accounts; and if in the East Indies, within Twelve Months after the Expiration of each Year's Accounts; unless it shall in each and every Case be made appear to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of the Treasury, that the Failure of transmitting the same, within the Periods beforementioned, was unavoidable; in which Case such further Delay may be granted by Warrant under the Hands of the Commissioners of the Treasury, or any Three of them, as they Shall judge reasonable; and in such Cases the Vouchers shall be delivered at the Expiration of the Term of Delay so granted, on Pain, upon Failure in

any of the abovementioned Cases, of paying field Fine to His Majetly as the Court of Exphancer, on Application made to rhem, shall think fit to fee and impose; which Fine the said Court is hereby authorized and impowered to set and impose accordingly.

SECTION XXII.
