7E, taking into Our most ferious Confideration the just and necessary War in which We are engaged with France, and putting Our Truft in Almighty God, that He will gracioufly blefs Our Arms, both by Sea and Land, have refolved, and do, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, hereby command, That a Publick Fast and Humiliation be observed throughout that Part of Our Kingdom of Great Britain called England, Our Dominion of Wales, and Town of Berwick upon Tweed, on Wednefday the Twenty-fifth Day of February next; that fo bach We and Our People may humble Ourfelves before Almighty God, in order to obtain Pardon of Oar Sins; and may, in the most devout and folemn Manner, fend up Oar Prayers and Supplications to the Divine Majefty, for averting those heavy. Judgements which Our manifold Sins and Provocations have most justly deferved ; and imploring his Bleffing and Affinance on Our Arms, and for reftoring and perpetuating Peace, Safety and Profperity to Us and Our Kingdoms : And We do firicity charge and command, That the faid Publick Faft be reverently and devoutly obferved by all Our loving Subjects in England, Oar Dominion of Wales, and Town of Berwick upon Tweed, as they tender the Favour of Almighty God, and would avoid His Wrath and Indignation; and upon Pain of fuch Punishment as We may justly inflict on all fuch as

- Prayers and Supplications to the Divine Majefly, for caverting those heavy Judgements which Our manifold Sins and Provocations have most justly deferved, and imploring His Bleffing and Afliftance on Our Arms, and for reftoring and perpetuating Peace, Safety, and Prosperity to Us and Our Kingdoms : And We do strictly charge and command, That the faid Publick Fait be reverently and devoutly observed by all Our loving Subjetts in Scotland, as they tender the Favour of Almighty God, and would avoid His Wrath and Indignation ; and upon Pain of fuch Punithment as We may justly inflist on all such as conrtemn and neglect the Performance of forreligious and neceffary a Duty. Our Will is therefore, and We charge, That this Our Proclamation Teen, ye forthwith pass to the Market-Cross of Edinburgh, and all other Places needful, and there, in Our Name and Authority, make Publication hereof, that none pretend Ignorance : And Our Will and Pleafure is, That Our Solicitor do caufe printed Copies hereof to be fent to the Sheriffs of the feveral Shires, Stewarts of Stewartries, and Bailiffs of Regalities, and their Clerks, whom We ordain to fee the fame published; and We appoint them to fend Copies hereof to the feveral Parish Churches within their Bounds, that upon the Lord's Day immediately preceding the Day above-mentioned, the fame may be published, and read from the Pulpits, immediately after Divine Service.

YIS Majefty, judging it expedient, under the present Circumstances, to admit into the Ports of this Kingdom all Goods, Wares, Merchandizes and Effects belonging to the Subjects or Inhabitants of the United Provinces, or to any of His Majefly's Subjects who may have Goods, Wares, Merchandizes or Effects in the faid United Provinces, in order that the fame may be preferved in fafe Cuitody, is pleafed, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, as it is hereby ordered, That all Goods, Wares, Merchandizes and Effects whatfoever, coming directly from any of the Ports of the United Provinces to any of the Ports of this Kingdom, in the Veffels of any Country, and navigated in any Manner, be permitted, until further Order, to be landed, and to be fecured in Warehouses, under the joint Locks of His Majefty and of the Proprietors, at the

Rifk and Expence of the faid Proprietors, there to remain in safe Cuilody, for the Benefit of the Proprietors thereof, until due Provision shall be made by Law to enable fuch Proprietors to re-export, or otherwife difpose of the fame. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necellary Directions herein accordingly.

N The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

VV HERBAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Order in Council of the Sixteenth of July last, prohibiting the transporting into any Parts out of this Kingdom any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Pemp, Pitch, Tar, Rofin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Maits, Yards, Bowfprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, will expire upon the Twenty-fifth Day of this inftant January; and whereas it is judged expedient for His Majelly's Service, and the Safety of this-Kingdom, that the fild Prohibition fhould be continued for fome Time longer. His Majelty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order. require, prohibit and command, that no Perfon or Perfons whofoever. do at a y Time, for the Space of Six Months, to commence from the faid Twenty fifth Day of this inflant January, prefume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, any Pig Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rohn, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Mafts, Yards, Bowfprits, Oars; Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores; or thip or lade any of the Articles above mentioned on blard any Ship or Veffel, in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, without Leave or Permifion being fift had and obtained from His Majefty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Fo feitures inflicted by an Act, paffed in the Thirty third Year of His Majefiy's Reign, intituled, "An Act to ena-" ble His Majefty to reftrain the Exportation of Na-" val Stores, and more effectually to prevent the Ex-" portation of Salt Petre, Arms and Ammunition, "when prohibited by Proclamation or Order in " Council." But it is, neverthelefs, His Majefty's Pleafure, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be confirmed to extend, to any of His Majefty's Ships of War, or any other Ships or Veffels or Boats, in the Service of His Majetty, or employed or freighted by His Majesly's Board of Ordnance, or by the Commissioners of His Majefty's.

jefty's Navy; nor to prevent any Ship or Veffel from taking or having on Board fuch Quantities cof Naval Stores as may be necessary for the Use of :fuch Ship or Veffel during the Course of her instended Voyage, or by Licence from the Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, or the Commissioners of the Admiralty for the Time being ; nor to the Exportation of the faid feveral Aticles to Ireland, or to His Majefty's Yards or Garrifons, or to His Majelty's Colonies or Plantations in America, or the West Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majefty's Forts and Settlements on the Coaft of Africa; or to the Island of St. Helena, or the Britich Settlements or Factories in the East Indies ; provided that, upon the Exportation of any of the frid Articles, for the Purpofes of Trade, to Irejand, or to His Majefty's Yards or Garrifons, or to His Majefty's Colonies and Plantations in Ame--rica, or the West Indies, or to the Island of Newfoundland, or to His Majeffy's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies, the Exporters of such Articles .do first make Oath of the true Destination of the fame to the Places for which they shall be entered Outwards, before the Entry of the fame shall be made, and do give full and fufficient Security by Bond, to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of :His Majefty's Cuftoms, to carry the faid Articles to the Flaces for which they are to entered Outwarls, and for the Purpofes [specified,' and none other; and fuch Bond fall not be cancelled or delivered up, until Proof be made, to the Satisfaction of the faid Commissioners, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the faid Commiffioners, and specified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in fuch Form and Manner as shall be directed by the faid Commissioners, chewing that the faid Articles have been duly landed at the Places for which they were entered Outwards. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majely's Freafury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the neceffary Directions herein, .as to them may respectively appertain.
