Prayers and Supplications to the Divine Majesty, for averting those heavy Judgements which Our mainfold Sins and Provocations have most justly deserved, and imploring His Bleffing and Affiftance on Our Arms, and for restoring and perpetuating Peace, Safety, and Prosperity to Us and Our Kingdoms: And We do strictly charge and command, That the faid Publick Fast be reverently and devoutly observed by all Our loving Subjects in Scotland, as they tender the Favour of Almighty God, and would avoid His Wrath and Indignation; and upon Pain of fuch Punishment as We may justly inslict on all such as contemn and neglect the Performance of fo religious and necessary a Duty. Our Will is therefore, and Wo charge, That this Our Proclamation feen, ye forthwith pass to the Market Cross of Edinburgh, and all other Places needful, and there, in Our Name and Authority, make Publication hereof, that none pretend Ignorance: And Our Will and Pleafure is, That Our Solicitor do cause printed Copies hereo to be fent to the Sheriffs of the feveral Shire's Stewarts of Stewartries, and Bailiffs of Regalities and their Clerks, whom We ordain to fee the fame published; and We appoint them to send Copies hereof to the several Parish Churches within their Bounds, that upon the Lord's Day immediately preceding the Day above-mentioned, the same may be published, and read from the Pulpits, immediately after Divine Service.

THEREAS His Majesty, by His Order in Conneil, bearing Date the 16th Inflant, was pleafed to direct, That all Goods, Wares, Merchandizes and Effects whatfoever, coming directly from any of the Ports of the Enited Provinces to any of the Ports of this Kingdom, in the Vessels of any Country, and navigated in any Manner, should be permitted, until further Order, to be lauded, and decured in Warehouses, under the joint Locks of His Majesty and of the Proprietors, at the Risk and Expence of the faid Proprietors, there to remain in fase Custody, for the Benefit of the Proprietors thereof, until due Provision shall be made by Law to enable fuch Proprietors to re-export, or otherwise dispose of the same .: And whereas it is judged expedient His Majesty is thereupon pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, as it is hereby ordered, that all Goods, Wares, Merchandizes and Effects whatfoever, belonging to any of the Subjects or Inhabitants of the United Provinces, or belonging to any Subject of His Majesty, or to any Subject of any Country in Amity with His Majelly, coming from any Part of Europe, Alia, Africa or America, in Amity with His Majesty, in Vessels belonging to any Subject or Inhabitant of the United Provinces, or to any Subject of His Majesty, or of any Country in Amity with His Majesty, and bound to any Port of the United Provinces, may, until further Order, be permitted to be landed in any Port of this Kingdom, and may be secured in Warehouses, for the Beneat of the Proprietors thereof, in the same Manner as was directed in the above mentioned Order of His Mej. ity in Conneil, bearing Date the 16th of this inflant January. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary Directions herein accordingly.
