scommence from the faid Twenty fifth Day of this ! instant January, presunce to transport into any Parts sout of this Kingdom, any Pig Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rosin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, ¿Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores; or ship or lade any of the Articles above ementioned on board any Ship or Vessel, in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, without Leave or Permission being first thad and obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Fo-feitures inflicted by an Act, passed in the Thirty third Year cof His Majesty's Reign, intimied, "An Act to ena-" ble His Majesty to restrain the Faportation of Mawal Stores, and more effectually to prevent the Exportation of Salt Petre, Arms and Ammunition, when prohibited by Proclamation or Order in " Council." But it is, nevertheles, I he Majesty's Pleafure, that nothing herein contained shall exstend, or be condrued to extend, to any of His Majetty's Ships of War, or any other Ships or Vessels or Boats, in the Service of His Majefty, or cm. ployed or freighted by His Majesty's Board of Ordrance, or by the Commissioners of His Maiesty's Navy; nor to prevent any Ship or Vessel from taking or having on Board such Quantities of Navel Stores as may be necessary for the Use of fuch Ship or Vessel during the Course of her instended Voyage, or by Licence from the Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, or the Commissioners of the Admiralty for the Time being; nor to the Exportation of the faid several Aticles to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Yards or Garrisons, or to His Majesty's Colonies or Plantations in America, or the West Indies, or to Newsoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa; or to the Island of St. Hele ia, or the Bristilh Settlements or Factories in the East Indies; provided that, upon the Exportation of any of the Laid Articles, for the Purposes of Trade, to Ire-Land, or to His Majesty's Yards or Garrisons, or to His Majesty's Colonies and Plantations in Amecrica, or the West Indies, or to the Island of Newfoundland, or to His Majelly's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies, the Exporters of such Articles do first make Oath of the true Destination of the fame to the Places for which they shall be entered Outwards, before the Entry of the same shall be made, and do give full and sufficient Security by Bond, to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of

His Majesty's Customs, to carry the Taid Articles to the Places for which they are so entered Outwards, and for the Purpoles Ifpecified, and none other; and such Bond shall not be cancelled or delivered up, until Proof beamade, to the Satisfaction of the faid Commissioners, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the faid Commifsioners, and specified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in such Form and Manner as shall be directed by the faid Commissioners, shewing that the faid Articles have been duly landed at the Places for which they were entered Outwards. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majehy's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the accessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain-
