Whitehall, January 13, 1795,

Whereas it has been humbly represented to the King, that on the 12th of January instant, David Price and Barnaby Windsor, Two of the Constables belonging to the Public Office, at Union Hall, Southwark, were, in attempting to apprehend Two Persons against whom an Information had been duly made of a Robbery and Burglary, fired at and shot, whereby the said David

Price was immediately killed, and the said Barnaby Windsor dangerously wounded.

His Majesty, for better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in the above daring Act of Violence and Murder, is hereby graciously pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any Person (except the Person or Persons who actually fired upon and killed the said David Price, and fired upon and wounded the said Barnaby Windsor) who shall discover the Person or Persons concerned in the said Murder, so that he or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.

And, as a further Encouragement, the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury do hereby promise a Reward of ONE HUNDRED POUNDS to any Person or Persons, except as before excepted, to be paid on Conviction of any One or more of the Offenders.

Whereas it has been humbly represented to the King, that, at about Eleven o'Clock in the Night of the 6th of December, 1794, a Barn, called Sunwool Barn, situate at Heybott in the County of Suffex, belonging to Mr. John Newman, of Cocking, was discovered to be on Fire, and totally consumed, with a Quantity of Corn therein, and there are very strong Reasons to suspect that the said Barn was maliciously set on Fire by some Person or Persons unknown.

His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Person or Persons concerned in setting Fire to the Barn abovementioned, is hereby pleased to promise his most gracious Pardon to any one of them, (except the Person who actually set Fire thereto) who shall discover his or her Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he, she or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.

And, as a farther Encouragement, a Reward of TWO HUNDRED and FIFTY POUNDS is hereby offered to any Person making such Discovery as aforesaid, (except as is before excepted) to be paid upon Conviction of any One or more of the Offenders, by Mr. Richard Cobden, Bailiff of the Borough of Midsburst.

And, as a yet farther Encouragement, an additional Reward of ONE HUNDRED POUNDS is also hereby offered to any Person making such Discovery (except as aforesaid) to be paid on the abovementioned Conviction, by the Sun Fire Insurance Office.
