Our Will is therefore, and We charge, That this Our Proclamation feen, ye forthwith pafs to the Market-Crofs of Edinburgh, and all other Places needful, and there, in Our Name and Authority, make Publication hereof, that none pretend Ignorance: And Our Will and Pleafure is, That Our Solicitor do caufe printed Copies hercof to be fent to the Sheriffs of the feveral Shires, Stewarts of Stewartries, and Bailiffs of Regalities, and their Clerks, whom We ordain to fee the fame published; and We appoint them to fend Copies hereof to the feveral Parish Churches within their Bounds, that upon the Lord's Day immediately preceding the Day above-mentioned; the fame may be published, and read from the Pulpits, immediately after Divine Service.
