The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS it has been represented to His Majesty at this Board, That, in consequence of the Progress of the French Arms in the United Provinces, the Payment of Bills of Exchange drawn or negotiated in the said Provinces may be deemed unlawful, by virtue of the Provisions contained in an Act, passed in the last Session of Parliament, intituled, "An Act for preventing Money or Effects in the Hands of His Majesty's Subjects, belonging to or disposeable by Persons resident in France, being applied to the Use of the Persons exercising the Powers of Government in France, and for preserving the Property thereof for the Benefit of the individual Owners thereof," and in an Act, passed in the same Session, intituled, "An Act for more effectually preserving Money or Effects, in the Hands of His Majesty's Subjects, belonging to or disposeable by Persons resident in France, for the Benefit of the individual Owners thereof," unless His Majesty shall license the Payment of such Bills, in pursuance of the Powers given by the said several Acts: His Majesty, taking the same into His Royal Consideration, is pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, That it shall be lawful for any Person, residing or being in Great Britain, to pay any Bill, drawn or indorsed in any Part of the said United Provinces, and sent from the said Provinces on or before the Sixteenth Day of January last; provided such Bill shall have been made pay-

able at no greater Distance of Time than Three Months from the Date thereof, or Three Months from Sight thereof; provided also, that all and every Person and Persons, who shall take the Benefit of such Licence hereby granted, shall so take the same, upon Condition, that in case of any Proceeding, Criminal or Civil, under the Provisions of the said Acts of Parliament, or either of them, for any Thing alleged to have been done contrary thereto, any Question shall arise, whether the Thing so done was authorized by the Licence hereby given, the Proof that such Thing was done under the particular Circumstances, and according to the special Terms and Conditions required by this Order, shall lie on the Persons claiming the Benefit of such Licence.

WHEREAS there was this Day read at the Board a Representation from the Right Honorable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council appointed for the Consideration of all Matters relating to Trade and Foreign Plantations, dated the 29th of last Month, in the Words following, viz.

"May it please your Majesty,

"THE Lords of the Committee being of Opinion that it may be adviseable for your Majesty to allow the Importation into the Island of Newfoundland of Bread, Flour and Indian Corn, from any of the Territories belonging to the United States of America, for the Supply of the Inhabitants and

" Fishermen of the said Island, for the ensuing Season only, in like Manner as your Majesty has been pleased to permit such Importation for the Six preceding Years; their Lordships humbly take Leave to lay herewith before your Majesty the Draught of an Order proper to be issued by your Majesty in Council, and a Warrant, under your Majesty's Sign Manual, to the Governor of Newfoundland, for the Purpose above-mentioned."

His Majesty, having taken the same into Consideration, was pleased, with the Advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed, and also of the Draught of the Order in Council, and of the Warrant to the Governor of Newfoundland, for the respective Purposes therein mentioned.

And His Majesty doth hereby order, that his Grace the Duke of Portland, One of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, do prepare the said Warrant (Copy whereof is hereunto annexed) to the Governor of Newfoundland, for His Majesty's Royal Signature.

**W**HEREAS by an Act passed in the Twentieth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled, "An Act for regulating the Trade between the Subjects of His Majesty's Colonies and Plantations in North America and in the West India Islands, and the Countries belonging to the United States of America, and between His Majesty's said Subjects and the Foreign Islands in the West Indies," it is, amongst other Things, enacted, That it shall and may be lawful for His Majesty in Council, by Order or Orders to be issued and published from Time to Time, to authorize, or by Warrant or Warrants, under His Sign Manual, to empower the Governor of Newfoundland for the Time being to authorize, in case of Necessity, the Importation into Newfoundland of Bread, Flour, Indian Corn, and Live Stock, from any of the Territories belonging to the United States, for the Supply of the Inhabitants and Fishermen of the Island of Newfoundland, for the then ensuing Season only; provided always, that such Bread, Flour, Indian Corn, and Live Stock, so authorized to be imported into the said Island of Newfoundland, shall not be imported except in conformity to such Rules, Regulations and Restrictions as shall be specified in such Order or Orders, Warrant or Warrants, respectively, and except by British Subjects and in British-built Ships owned by His Majesty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law.

It is Our Royal Will and Pleasure, and We do, by virtue of the Power vested in Us by the said Act, hereby empower you to authorize, in case of Necessity, the Importation into Newfoundland of

Bread, Flour, and Indian Corn, from any of the Territories belonging to the said United States of America, for the Supply of the Inhabitants and Fishermen of Our Island of Newfoundland, for the ensuing Season only; provided that such Bread, Flour, and Indian Corn so authorized to be imported into Our Island of Newfoundland shall not be imported except by British Subjects and in British-built Ships, owned by His Majesty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law; provided also that such Ships as aforesaid shall clear out from some of the Ports of the said Island for any of the said United States, and shall be duly licensed for that Purpose by you, or such other Person or Persons as shall, by an Instrument under your Hand and Seal, be authorized to license the same.

And We do hereby order and direct that such Licences so to be granted by you, or by any Person or Persons duly authorized as aforesaid, shall be of the like Nature, as near as the Circumstances will admit, with those which are directed to be granted to Ships clearing out from Great Britain, by an Act passed in the 25th Year of Our Reign, intituled, "An Act for continuing, for a limited Time, the Trade between the Ports of the United States of America and His Majesty's Subjects of the Island of Newfoundland, to Bread, Flour and Live Stock, to be imported in none but British-built Ships, actually belonging to British Subjects, and navigated according to Law, clearing out from the Ports of His Majesty's European Dominions, and furnished with a Licence according to the Form hereunto annexed."

And We do hereby strictly charge and command you, that, in granting of such Licences as aforesaid, especial Care be taken to prevent all contraband and fraudulent Trade between the Inhabitants and Fishermen of Our said Island of Newfoundland, and the People belonging to the Territories of the United States of America.

**W**HEREAS by an Act passed in the Thirty-third Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act to amend an Act made in the Thirty-first Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled, An Act for regulating the Importation and Exportation of Corn, and the Payment of the Duty on Foreign Corn imported, and of the Bounty on British Corn exported," it is, amongst other Things, enacted, That it shall and may be lawful for His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors,

cessors, and He and They is and are thereby authorized, with the Advice of His or Their Privy Council, at any Time when the General Average Price of any Sort of Corn or of Oatmeal, in England or Scotland respectively, taken as in the said Acts, passed in the Thirty-first and Thirty-third Years of His present Majesty's Reign, is directed, shall appear to be at or above the Price at or above which Foreign Corn, Meal or Flour of the same Sort is allowed by Law to be imported from Ireland or the Province of Quebec, or the other British Colonies and Plantations in North America, at the first Low Duties specified in the Table marked E. in the said Act passed in the Thirty-first Year of His present Majesty's Reign, to prohibit generally, for a limited Time, the Exportation from England and Scotland respectively, as the Case may be, of any such Sort of Corn or other Articles mentioned in the said Acts; and in like Manner, at any Time when the Average Price of any Sort of Corn or of Oatmeal, in England or Scotland respectively, taken as in the said Acts, passed in the Thirty-first and Thirty-third Years of His present Majesty's Reign, is directed, shall appear to be at or above the Price at or above which Foreign Corn, Meal or Flour of the same Sort is allowed by Law to be imported from any other Foreign Country at the first Low Duty specified in the said Table marked E. to permit generally the Importation into England or Scotland respectively, as the Case may be, or the taking out of Warehouse for Home Consumption, of any such Sort of Foreign Corn, Meal or Flour, on Payment of the second Low Duty only, and no other; and in the like Manner to recall such Prohibition or Permission, if Circumstances shall appear so to require: Provided always, that as often as the Importation of any Sort of Corn, Meal or Flour, on the Low Duties, shall be permitted by His Majesty, His Heirs or Successors, by and with the Advice of His or Their Privy Council, such Permission shall continue in Force for the Space of Three Months at least from the Date of the Order in Council made for that Purpose.

And whereas, in pursuance of the Powers vested in His Majesty by the said Act passed in the Thirty-third Year of His present Majesty's Reign, His Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, was pleased, by His Order in Council bearing Date the 28th of August, 1793, to prohibit (under the Provisions, Regulations and Exceptions therein mentioned and referred to) until the 30th of November then ensuing, the Exportation from any of the Ports of that Part of Great Britain called England of any Rye, Pease, Beans, Barley, Beer or Bigg, or Oats, or any Meal, Flour, Malt, Bread or Biscuit made of Oats, or Oatmeal; and also to import into any Port

or Place in that Part of Great Britain called Scotland, and to take out of Warehouse for Home Consumption, any Foreign Barley, Pease, Oats and Oatmeal, on Payment of the second Low Duty only, mentioned in the said Table marked E. and no other; which Order has, by several subsequent Orders, been since revived and continued, and is now to remain in Force until the 1st Day of February, 1795.

And whereas it appears, from the Returns received in the Week ended the Third Day of January, 1795, that the General Average Prices of Rye, Pease, Beans, Barley, Beer or Bigg, Oats and Oatmeal, in that Part of Great Britain called England, are above the Prices at which Foreign Rye, Pease, Beans, Barley, Beer or Bigg, Oats and Oatmeal, are allowed by Law to be imported at the first Low Duty specified in the said Table marked E.; His Majesty, therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, pursuant to the Powers given by the said Act, hath thought fit to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Prohibition to export Rye, Pease, Beans, Barley, Beer or Bigg, or Oats, or any Meal, Flour, Malt, Bread or Biscuit made thereof, from any Port or Place in that Part of Great Britain called England, and every Provision respecting the said Prohibition in the said Order of the Twenty-eighth Day of August, 1793, shall be and continue in Force until the Third Day of June, 1795.

And whereas it appears, from the Returns received in the Month immediately preceding the Fifteenth Day of January, 1795, that the General Average Price of Barley, Beer and Bigg, Oats and Oatmeal, in that Part of Great Britain called Scotland, is above the Price at which Foreign Barley, Beer or Bigg, Oats and Oatmeal, are allowed by Law to be imported at the first Low Duty specified in the said Table marked E.; His Majesty, therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, pursuant to the Powers given by the said Act, hath thought fit to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Prohibition to export Barley, Beer and Bigg, Oats and Oatmeal, from any Port or Place in that Part of Great Britain called Scotland, and every Provision, Regulation and Exception respecting the said Prohibition in the said Order of the Twenty-eighth Day of August, 1793, shall be, and the same is hereby revived, and shall continue in Force until the Third Day of June, 1795.

And His Majesty, by and with the Advice aforesaid, hath thought fit further to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Permission to import into any Port or Place in that Part of Great Britain called England, any Foreign Rye, Pease, Beans, Barley, Beer or Bigg, Oats or Oatmeal, and into any Port or Place in that Part of Great Britain called Scotland, any Foreign Barley or Oats, and to take

the same out of Warehouse, for Home Consumption, on Payment of the second Low Duty only, mentioned in the said Table marked E. and no other, and every Provision and Regulation respecting the said Importation, in the said Order of the Twentyeighth Day of August, 1793, contained, shall be, and the same is hereby revived, and shall continue in Force until the said Third Day of June, 1795.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary Directions herein accordingly.
