The KING's Most Excellent Mujesty in Council. HEREAS it has been represented to His Majesty at this Board, That, in consequence of the Progress of the French Arms in the United Provinces, the Payment of Bills of Exchange drawn or negotiated in the faid Provinces may be deemed unlawful, by virtue of the Provisions contained in an Act, passed in the last Session of Parliament, intituled, " An Act for preventing Mo-" ney or Effects in the Hands of His Majesty's Suber jects, belonging to or disposeable by Persons resi-" dent in France, being applied to the Use of the " Persons exercising the Powers of Government in " France, and for preferving the Property thereof " for the Benefit of the individual Owners thereof," and in an Act, passed in the same Session, intituled, " An Act for more effectually preferving Money or " Effects, in the Hands of His Majesty's Subjects, " belonging to or disposeable by Persons resident in " France, for the Benefit of the individual Owners " thereof," unless His Majesty shall license the Payment of fuch Bills, in pursuance of the Powers given by the said several Acts: His Majesty, taking the same into His Royal Consideration, is pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, That it shall be lawful for any Person, residing or being in Great Britain, to pay any Bill, drawn or indorfed in any Part of the faid United Provinces, and fent from the faid Provinces on or before the Sixteenth Day of January last; provided such Bill shall have been made payable at no greater Distance of Time than Three Months from the Date thereof, or Three Months from Sight thereof; provided also, that all and eve y Person and Persons, who shall take the Benefit of such Licence hereby granted, shall so take the same, upon Condition, that in case of any Proceeding, Criminal or Civil, under the Provisions of the said Acts of Parliament, or either of them, for any Thing alledged to have been done contrary thereto, any Question shall arise, whether the Thing so done was authorized by the Licence hereby given, the Proof that such Thing was done under the particular Circumstances, and according to the special Terms and Conditions required by this Order, shall lie on the Persons claiming the Benefit of such Licence.

WHEREAS there was this Day read at the
Board a Representation from the Right Honorable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council appointed for the Consideration of all Matters relating to Trade and Foreign Plantations, dated the
29th of last Month, in the Words following, viz.

" May it please your Majesty,

"THE Lords of the Committee being of Opinion that it may be adviseable for your Majesty to allow the Importation into the Island of Newsound Iand of Bread, Flour and Indian Corn, from any of the Territories belonging to the United States of America, for the Supply of the Inhabitants and

fishermen of the said Island, for the ensuing Seafon only, in like Manner as your Majesty has
been pleased to permit such Importation for the
Six preceding Years; their Lordships humbly take
Leave to lay herewith before your Majesty the
Draught of an Order proper to be issued by your
Majesty in Council, and a Warrant, under your
Majesty's Sign Manual, to the Governor of Newfoundland, for the Purpose above mentioned."

His Majesty, having taken the same into Consideration, was pleased, with the Advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed, and also of the Draught of the Order in Council, and of the Warrant to the Governor of Newfoundland, for the respective Purposes therein mentioned.

And His Majesty doth hereby order, that his Grace the Duke of Portland, One of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, do prepare the faid Warrant (Copy whereof is hereunto annexed) to the Governor of Newfoundland, for His Majesty's Royal Signature.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the Twentyeighth Year of the Reign of His present . Majesty, intituled, "An Act for regulating the Trade between the Subjects of His Majesty's Coionies and Plantations in North America and in the " West India Islands, and the Countries belonging to the United States of America, and between 46 His Majesty's said Subjects and the Foreign Islands " in the West Indies," it is, amongst other Things, enacted, That it shall and may be lawful for His Majesty in Council, by Order or Orders to be issued and published from Time to Time, to authorize, or by Warrant or Warrants, under His Sign Manual, to impower the Governor of Newfoundland for the Time being to authorize, in case of Necessity, the Importation into Newfoundland of Bread, Flour, Indian Corn, and Live Stock, from any of the Territories belonging to the United States, for the Supply of the Inhabitants and Fishermen of the Island of Newfoundland, for the then ensuing Season, only; provided always, that fuch Bread, Flour, Indian Corn, and Live Stock, , fo authorized to be imported into the faid Island of Newfoundland, shall not be imported except in conformity to fuch Rules, Regulations and Restrica tions as shall be specified in such Order or Orders, Warrant or Warrants, respectively, and except by British Subjects and in British-built Ships owned by His Majesty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law.

It is Our Royal Will and Pleasure, and We do, by virtue of the Power vessed in Us by the said Act, hereby impower you to authorize, in case of Necessity, the Importation into Newsoundland or

Bread, Flour, and Indian Corn, from any of the Territories belonging to the faid United States of America, for the Supply of the Inhabitants and Fishermen of Our Island of Newfoundland, for the enfuing Season only; provided that such Bread, Flour, and Indian Corn so authorized to be imported into Our Island of Newfoundland shell not be imported except by British Subjects and in British built Ships, owned by His Majesty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law; provided also that such Ships as aforefaid shall clear out from some of the Ports of the faid Island for any of the faid United States. and shall be duly licensed for that Purpose by you, or such other Person or Persons as shall, by an Instrument under your Hand and Seal, he authorized to license the same.

And We do hereby order and direct that such Licences fo to be granted by you, or by any Person or Persons duly authorized as aforesaid, shall be of the like Nature, as near as the Circumstances will admit, with those which are directed to be granted to Ships clearing out from Great Britain, by an Act passed in the 25th Year of Our Reign, intituled, " An Act for comining, for a limited Time, the " Trade between the Ports of the United States of " America and His Majesty's Subjects of the Island 66 Newfoundland, to Bread, Flour and Live Stock, " to be imported in none but British-built Ships, " actually belonging to British Subjects, and navi-" gated according Law, clearing out from the " Ports of His Majetly's Europe in Dominions, and " furnished with a License according to the Form " hereunto annexed."

And We do hereby firstly charge and command you, that, in granting of such Licences as aforesaid, especial Care be taken to prevent all contraband and fraudulent Trade between the Inhabitants and Fishermen of Our said Island of Newsoundland, and the People belonging to the Territories of the United States of America.

.And whereas it appears, from the Returns received in the Week ended the Third Day of January, 1795, that the General Average Prices of Rye, Peafe, Beans, Barley, Beer or Bigg, Oats and Oatmeal, in that Part of Great Britain called England, are above the Prices at which Foreign Rye, Peafe, Beans, Barley, Beer or Bigg, Oats and Oatmeal, are allowed by Law to be imported at the first Low Duty specified in the faid Table marked E.; His Majesty, therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, pursuant to the Powers given by the said Act, hath thought fit to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Prohibition to export Rye, Peafe, Beans, Barley, Beer or Bigg, or Oats, or any Meal, Flour, Malt, Bread or Biscuit made thereof, from any Port or Place in that Part of Great Britain called England, and every Provision respecting the faid Prohibition in the faid Order of the Twentyeighth Day of August, 1793, shall be and continue in Force until the Third Day of June, 1795.

And whereas it appears, from the Returns received in the Month immediately preceding the Fifteenth Day of January, 1795, that the General Average Price of Barley, Beer and Bigg, Oats and Oatmeal, in that Part of Great Britain called Sectland, is above the Price at which Foreign Barley, Beer or Bigg, Oats and Oatmeal, are allowed by Law to be imported at the first Low Duty specified in the said Table marked E.; His Majesty, therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, pursuant to the Powers given by the faid Act, hath thought fit to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Prohibision to export Barley, Beer and Bigg, Oats and Oatmeal, from any Port or Place in that Pert of Great Britain cailed Scotland, and every Provision, Regulation and Exception respecting the said Prohibition in the faid Order of the Twenty-eighth Day of August, 1793, shall be, and the same is hereby revived, and shall continue in Force until the Third Day of June, 1795.

And His Majesty, by and with the Advice aforefaid, hath thought fit further to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Permission to import into any Port or Place in that Part of Great Britain called England, any Foreign Rye, Pease, Beans, Barley, Beer or Eigg, Oats or Oatmeal, and into

the same out of Warehouse, for Home Consumption, on Payment of the fecond Low Duty only, mentioned in the faid Table marked E. and no other, and every Provision and Regulation respecting the faid Importation, in the faid Order of the Twentyeighth Day of August, 1793, contained, shall be, and the same is hereby revived, and shall continue in Force until the faid Third Day of June, 1795.

And the Right Honorable the Lords Commiffioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary Directions herein accordingly.
