The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

**THEREAS** it has been reprefented to His Majefty at this Board, That, in confequence of the Progress of the French Arms in the United Provinces, the Payment of Bills of Exchange drawn or negotiated in the faid Provinces may be deemed unlawful, by virtue of the Provisions contained in an A&, passed in the last Session of Parliament, intituled, " An Act for preventing Mo-"" ney or Effects in the Hands of His Majefty's Sub-" jects, belonging to or disposeable by Persons refi-Mr dent in France, being applied to the Ufe of the " Perfons exercifing the Powers of Government in " France, and for preferving the Property thereof \* for the Benefit of the individual Owners thereof," and in an A&, passed in the fame Session, intituled, " An Act for more effectually preferving Money or " Effects, in the Hands of His Majefty's Subjects, " belonging to or disposeable by Persons relident in - France, for the Benefit of the individual Owners " thereof," unlefs His Majefty shall license the Payment of fuch Bills, in purfuance of the Powers given by the faid feveral Acts : His Majefty, taking the Same into His Royal Confideration, is pleafed, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, That it shall be lawful for any-Perfon, reliding or being in Great Britain, to pay any Bill, drawn or indorfed in any Part of the faid United Provinces, and fent from the faid Provinces on or before the Sixteenth Day of January

laft; provided fuch Bill shall have been made parable at no greater Diffance of Time than Three Months from the Date thereof, or Three Months from Sight thereof; provided alfo, that all and every Perfon and Perfons, who shall take the Benefit of fuch Licence hereby granted, shall fo take the fame, upon Condition, that in cafe of any Proceeding, Criminal or Civil, under the Provisions of the faid Acts of Parliament, or either of them, for any Thing alledged to have been done contrary thereto, any Question shall arise, whether the Thing fo done was authorized by the Licence hereby given, the Ptoof that fuch Thing was done under the particular Circumftances, and according to the special Terms and Conditions required by this Order, shall lie on the Perfons claiming the Benefit of fuch Licence.

IN Confequence of the prefent Interruption to the Correspondence between this Country and Holland, a Communication will be immediately opened by His Majesty's Packet-Boats between Yarmcuth and the Elbe, and the Mails will be made up and diffatched from this Office every Juefday and Friday Night as ujual; and as the Letters to and from all Parts of Europe, except Spain and Portugal, will now be fent through this Channel, it is necessary to inform the Public, that from this Time, the Postage of all Letters to Holland or Flanders, mult be paid before-band, the fame as to Hamburgh, ot all Parts of Germany, and the North of Europe, at the Rate of One Shilling each fingle Letter, Two Shillings double, Three Shillings treble, and Four Shillings the Ownee, without which they cannot be forwarded; and the fame Rates are to be paid for all Letters from those Countries.

Befides the foregoing Rates of Foreign Postage, it noill be necessary, as usual, to pay at the Office in Great Britain or Ireland, where such Letters are put ; in: the full Port to Londrn.
