

His Majesty, nevertheless, by the Advice aforesaid, hath thought fit to order, and it is hereby ordered, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be construed to extend, to prohibit the Exportation from this Kingdom of any Foreign Corn, Meal or Flour that shall have been imported and warehoused in the Manner and on the Conditions mentioned in the before mentioned Act passed in the Thirty-first Year of His present Majesty's Reign, and shall not have been taken out of such Warehouse for Home Consumption, nor to prevent the carrying Coastwise, or carrying out, or the Exportation of the several Sorts of Corn, or other Articles as aforesaid, from this Kingdom, for any of the Purposes mentioned in the said Two Acts, passed in the Thirty-first and Thirty-third Years of His present Majesty's Reign, or either of them, in like Manner, and in the same Proportions and Quantities, and from and to the same Ports and Places, as is allowed by the said Two Acts passed in the 31st and 33d Years of His present Majesty's Reign, or either of them, at such Times as any of the several Sorts of Corn, or other Articles as aforesaid, are prohibited to be exported, in consequence of the Provisions contained in the said Two Acts, subject to the like Securities, Conditions, Regulations and Restrictions, Forfeitures and Penalties, as are by the said Two Acts, or by either of them, in any such Case, required or imposed.

And His Majesty, by and with the Advice aforesaid, hath thought fit further to order, and it is hereby ordered, That from and after the Date of this present Order, until the 30th Day of September next, it shall be lawful to import into any Port or Place of this Kingdom, any Foreign Corn or other Articles as aforesaid, in any British Ship or Vessel, or in any other Ship or Vessel, belonging to Persons of any Kingdom or State in Amity with His Majesty, and navigated in any Manner whatever, without Payment of any Duty whatsoever, and also to take out of Warehouse, for Home Consumption, any such Foreign Corn or other Articles as aforesaid, without Payment of any Duty whatsoever.

And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary Directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS there was this Day read at the Board a Representation from the Right Honorable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council appointed for the Consideration of all Matters relating to Trade and Foreign Plantations, dated the

29th of last Month, in the Words following, *viz.*

" May it please your Majesty,

" THE Lords of the Committee being of Opinion
" that it may be advisable for your Majesty to allow the Importation into the Island of Newfoundland of Bread, Flour and Indian Corn, from any of the Territories belonging to the United States of America, for the Supply of the Inhabitants and Fishermen of the said Island, for the ensuing Season only, in like Manner as your Majesty has been pleased to permit such Importation for the Six preceding Years; their Lordships humbly take Leave to lay herewith before your Majesty the Draught of an Order proper to be issued by your Majesty in Council, and a Warrant, under your Majesty's Sign Manual, to the Governor of Newfoundland, for the Purpose above mentioned."

His Majesty, having taken the same into Consideration, was pleased, with the Advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed, and also of the Draught of the Order in Council, and of the Warrant to the Governor of Newfoundland, for the respective Purposes therein mentioned.

And His Majesty doth hereby order, that his Grace the Duke of Portland, One of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, do prepare the said Warrant (Copy whereof is hereunto annexed) to the Governor of Newfoundland, for His Majesty's Royal Signature.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the Twentieth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled, " An Act for regulating the Trade between the Subjects of His Majesty's Colonies and Plantations in North America and in the West India Islands, and the Countries belonging to the United States of America, and between His Majesty's said Subjects and the Foreign Islands in the West Indies," it is, amongst other Things, enacted, That it shall and may be lawful for His Majesty in Council, by Order or Orders to be issued and published from Time to Time, to authorize, or by Warrant or Warrants, under His Sign Manual, to empower the Governor of Newfoundland for the Time being to authorize, in case of Necessity, the Importation into Newfoundland of Bread, Flour, Indian Corn, and Live Stock, from any of the Territories belonging to the United States, for the Supply of the Inhabitants and Fishermen of the Island of Newfoundland, for the then ensuing Season only; provided always, that such Bread, Flour, Indian Corn, and Live Stock, so authorized to be imported into the said Island of Newfoundland, shall not be imported except in conformity to such Rules, Regulations and Restrictions as shall be specified in such Order or Orders,
