The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

**W**HEREAS it has been represented to His Majesty at this Board, That, in consequence of the Progress of the French Arms in the United Provinces, the Payment of Bills of Exchange drawn or negotiated in the said Provinces may be deemed unlawful, by virtue of the Provisions contained in an Act, passed in the last Session of Parliament, intituled, "An Act for preventing Money or Effects in the Hands of His Majesty's Subjects, belonging to or disposeable by Persons resident in France, being applied to the Use of the Persons exercising the Powers of Government in France, and for preserving the Property thereof for the Benefit of the individual Owners thereof," and in an Act, passed in the same Session, intituled, "An Act for more effectually preserving Money or Effects, in the Hands of His Majesty's Subjects, belonging to or disposeable by Persons resident in France, for the Benefit of the individual Owners thereof," unless His Majesty shall license the Payment of such Bills, in pursuance of the Powers given by the said several Acts: His Majesty, taking the same into His Royal Consideration, is pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, That it shall be lawful for any Person, residing or being in Great Britain, to pay any Bill, drawn or indorsed in any Part of the said United Provinces, and sent from the said Provinces on or before the Sixteenth Day of January last; provided such Bill shall have been made payable at no greater Distance of Time than Three

Months from the Date thereof, or Three Months from Sight thereof; provided also, that all and every Person and Persons, who shall take the Benefit of such Licence hereby granted, shall so take the same, upon Condition, that in case of any Proceeding, Criminal or Civil, under the Provisions of the said Acts of Parliament, or either of them, for any Thing alledged to have been done contrary thereto, any Question shall arise, whether the Thing so done was authorized by the Licence hereby given, the Proof that such Thing was done under the particular Circumstances, and according to the special Terms and Conditions required by this Order, shall lie on the Persons claiming the Benefit of such Licence.

SEVERAL Inhabitants, Householdors of the City and Liberty of Westminster, paying Scot and Lot, whose Names are thereunto subscribed, being Electors of Members to represent the said

City and Liberty in Parliament, on Behalf of themselves and many other Electors of the said City and Liberty, having this Day presented their Petition to the House of Commons, setting forth, That some Time on or about the Third Day of April, One thousand seven hundred and eighty-nine, a Select Committee of the House was appointed to try and determine the Merits of a certain Petition of Sir Samuel Hood, Baronet, Lord Hood of the Kingdom of Ireland, and also a Petition of several Inhabitants, Householdors of the City and Liberty of Westminster, paying Scot and Lot, severally complaining of an undue Election for the said City and Liberty, which said Select Committee did, on the Sixth Day of July, in the said Year of our Lord One thousand seven hundred and eighty-nine, report to the House, That it appeared to them the said Select Committee, that the Merits of the Petitions did, in Part, depend upon the Right of Election: The Parties were therefore required to deliver in Statements, in Writing, of the Right of Election for which they respectively contended. That in consequence thereof the Petitioner, Lord Hood, delivered in a Statement as follows: "The Petitioner, Lord Hood, states "the Right of Election for the City and Liberty of Westminster to be in the Inhabitants Householdors, paying Scot and Lot, within the united Parishes of St. Margaret and St. John, and the several Parishes of St. Paul Covent Garden, St. Ann, St. James, St. George Hanover-square, in the Liberty of St. Martin le Grand in the County of Middlesex, and in so much of the Parishes of St. Martin in the Fields, St. Clement Danes and St. Mary le Strand, as are not within any of the Four Wards of the Liberty of the Duchy of Lancaster, called the Temple-Bar Ward, the Royal Ward, the Middle Ward, and Precincts of the Savoy." That the Electors Petitioners delivered in a Statement as follows: "The Electors Petitioners state, that the Right of Election for the City and Liberty of Westminster is in the Inhabitants Householdors, paying Scot and Lot, within the united Parishes of St. Margaret and St. John, in the several Parishes of St. Paul Covent Garden, St. Ann, St. James, St. George Hanover-square, in the Liberty of St. Martin le Grand in the County of Middlesex, and in so much of the Parishes of St. Martin in the Fields, St. Clement Danes, and St. Mary le Strand, as are not within any of the Four Wards of the Liberty of the Duchy of Lancaster, called the Temple Bar Ward, the Royal Ward, the Middle Ward, and Precincts of the Savoy." That the Sitting Member, Lord John Townshend, delivered in a Statement as follows: "The Right of Election is in the Inhabitants Householdors, of the Parishes of St. Margaret and St. John, St. George Hanover-square, St. James Westminster, St. Martin in the Fields, St. Clement Danes, St. Mary le Strand, St. Mary le Savoy, St. Paul Covent Garden, St. Ann Soho, and the District of St. Martin le Grand." That upon the Statements delivered in by the Petitioners, the said Select Committee have determined, "That the Right of Election for the City and Liberty of Westminster is in the Inhabitants Householdors, paying Scot and Lot, within the united Parishes of St. Margaret and St. John, and the several Parishes of St. Paul Covent Garden, St. Ann, St. James, St. George Hanover-square, in the Liberty of St. Martin le Grand in the County of Middlesex, and in

"so much of the Parishes of St. Martin in the Fields, St. Clement Danes and St. Mary le Strand, as are not within any of the Four Wards of the Liberty of the Dutchy of Lancaster." That upon the Statement delivered in by the Sitting Member, the Committee have determined, "That the Right of Election, as set forth in the said Statement, is not the Right of Election for the said City and Liberty of Westminster." Madrid, January 28.

By Accounts published by this Court of the Proceedings of the Enemy before Rosas, dated the 11th Instant, it appears that the Place still held out, notwithstanding the Evacuation of the small Fort de la Trinidad; that the Operations of the Enemy had been considerably slackened by some deep Falls of Snow, and the general Inclemency of the Weather; and that a spirited Enterprize had been executed, by a small Body of Spanish Volunteers, on the Enemy's Park of Artillery, in which they succeeded in spiking 14 Guns, having killed and made Prisoners near 150 Artillery-Men.

Accounts have also been received here, that on the 10th Instant Admiral Langara, in cruising off the Coast of Catalonia, fell in with and captured the French Frigate *Ephigénie*, of 32 Guns, which had sailed from Toulon on the 4th Instant, in Company with *La Vestale*. They had been separated Three Days before in a Storm, in which it is supposed that *La Vestale* was lost.

In Consequence of the present Interruption to the Correspondence between this Country and Holland, a Communication will be immediately opened by His Majesty's Packet-Boats between Yarmouth and the Elbe, and the Mails will be made up and dispatched from this Office every,
