RESENT, The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. 7HEREAS it has been represented to His Majesty at this Board, That, in consequence of the Progress of the French Arms in the United Provinces, the Payment of Bills of Exchange drawn or negotiated in the faid Provinces may be deemed unlawful, by virtue of the Provisions contained in an Act, passed in the last Session of Parliament, intituled, " An Act for preventing Mo-\* ney or Effects in the Hands of His Majesty's Sub-" jects, belonging to or disposeable by Persons refi-" dent in France, being applied to the Use of the re Persons exercising the Powers of Government in " France, and for preserving the Property thereof " for the Benefit of the individual Owners thereof," and in an Act, passed in the same Session, intituled, " An A& for more effectually preserving Money or " Errects, in the Hands of His Majesty's Subjects, 56 belonging to or disposeable by Persons resident in France, for the Benefit of the individual Owners " thereof," unless His Majesty shall license the Payment of such Bills, in pursuance of the Powers given by the fill feveral Afts: His Majefly, taking the fame into His Royal Confideration, is pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, That it shall be lawful for any Person, residing or being in Great Britain, to pay any Bill, drawn or indorfed in any Part of the faid United Provinces, and fent from the faid Provinces on or before the Sixteenth Day of January last; provided such Bill shall have been made payMonths from the Date thereof, or Three Months from Sight thereof; provided also, that all and every Person and Persons, who shall take the Benesit of such Licence hereby granted, shall so take the same, upon Condition, that in case of any Proceeding, Criminal or Civil, under the Provisions of the said Acts of Parliament, or either of them, for any Thing alledged to have been done contrary thereto, any Question shall arise, whether the Thing so done was authorized by the Licence hereby given, the Proof that such Thing was done under the particular Circumstances, and according to the special Terms and Conditions required by this Order, shall lie on the Persons claiming the Benesit of such Licence.

Madrid, January 28.

By Accounts published by this Court of the Proceedings of the Enemy before Rosas, dated the 11th Instant, it appears that the Place still held out, notwithstanding the Evacuation of the small Fort de la Trinidad; that the Operations of the Enemy had been considerably slackened by some deep Falls of Snow, and the general Inclemency of the Weather; and that a spirited Enterprize had been exceuted, by a small Body of Spanish Volunteers, on the Enemy's Park of Artillery, in which they succeeded in spiking 14 Guns, having killed and made Prisoners near 150-Aptillery-Wen.

Accounts have also been received here, that on the 10th Instant Admiral Langara, in cruizing off the Coast of Catalonia, sell in with and captured the French Frigate l'Iphigenie, of 32 Guns, which had failed from Toulon on the 4th Instant, in Company with La Vestale. They had been separated Three Days before in a Storm, in which it is supposed that
