A<sup>T</sup> the Court at St. James's, the 13th of February, 1795,

P R E S E N Т, The KING's Mon Excellent Majefty in Council. "HEREAS by an Act, passed in this prefent Seffion of Parliament, intituled, " An Act " for enabling His Majefty to prohibit the Exporta-" tion and permit the Importation of Corn, and " for allowing the Importation of other Articles of " Provision for a limited Time without Payment of " Duty," it is enacted, That from and after the paffing of the faid Act, and until the Expiration of Six Weeks from the Commencement of the next Seffion of Parliament, it flisil and may be lawful for His Majefty, His Heirs and Succeffors, and he and they is and are thereby authorized, with the Advice of His or Their Privy Council, whatever may be the general Average Poice of Wheat, Rye, Bar ley, Beer or Bigg, Peafe, Peans, Oats or Oatmeel, in England or Scotlands respectively, from Time to Time, when and as often as the fame shall be judged expedient, to prohibit generally, for a limited Time; the Exportation from England and Scotland refpectively of any British or Foreign Wheat, Rye, Barley, Beer or Bigg, Peafe, Beans, Oats, or any Meal or Flour, or Bread, Bifcuit or Malt made thereof, or any Indian Corn or Maize, or Meal or Floar made thereof, and to permit generally the Importation into England or Scotland respectively of any Foreign Corn or other Articles as aforefaid, in any British Ship or Veffel, or in any other Ship or Veffel be-Imping to Perfons of any Kingdom or State in Amity with His Majefty, and navigated in any Manner whatever, without Payment of any Duty whatfoever; and also the taking out of Warehoafe

for Home Confumption, of any fuch Foreign Corn or other Articles as aforefaid, without Payment of any Duty whatfoever; and in like Manner to recal fuch Prohibition or Permittion, either in Part or in the Whole, if Circumitances shall appear fo to require, any Thing in an Act, pa.Ed in the 31ft Year of His prefent Majesty's Reign, intitu'ed, "An Act for regulating the Importation and E :portation of Corn, and the Payment of the Duty " on Foreign Corn imported, and of the Bounty on " British Corn exported," and ano her Act passed in the 33d Year of His prefent Majefty's Reign, for amending the aforefaid Act, or in any other Act, or Part of any Act, to the contrary notwithstanding, futject, neverthelefs, to the Provifoes therein mentioned, and herein after contained.

His Majefly thereupon, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, purfuant to the Powers given by the faid Adt, paffed in this prefert Section of Parliament, has thought fit to order, and it is hereby ordered, that from and after the Date of this prefeat Order, until the 50th Day of September next, no Perfon or Perfons whatbeever fhall export, or fhall load or lay on Board any Ship or other Veffel, with the Intent to export from any Port or Place of this Kingdom, any Wheat, Rye, Barley, Beer or Bigg, Peafe, Beans, Oats, Indian Corn or Maize, or any Meal or Flour, or Bread, Bifcuit or Malt made thereof.

His Majurty, neverthelefs, by the Advice aforefaid, hath thought fit to order, and it is hereby ordered, that nothing herein contribut final extend, or be confirued to extend, to prohibit the Exportation from this Kingdom of any Foreign Corn, Meal or Flour that fhall have been imported and warehoufed in the Magner
