## Horse Guards, March 10.

Dispatch, dated Embden, March 1, 1795, of which the following is an Extract, has been received by His Royal Highness the Duke of York, from Major-General A. Gordon, and communicated by His Royal Highness to the Right Honorable Henry Dundas, One of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State.

AN Opportunity for England offering this Moment, and of which Lieutenant-General Harcourt cannot avail himself, I have the Honor to report, for the Information of your Royal Highness, that the Fore-Posts, under the Command of Major-General Lord Catheart, extending from Fort Bourtange to Noicoe Shanks, were attacked and drove in, with some Loss, on the Morning of the 27th.

I am informed by his Lordship, that he was retiring by his Left with his whole Force, consisting of Major-General David Dundas's Brigade of Cavalry, the 6th Brigade of Infantry, with some Detachments of Foreign Light Troops, and intended recrossing the River Ems at Rhude and Meppen.

I also understand that the Fore-Poss of the Lest Wing were drove in some Days before, but I have not been able to learn any Particulars.
