A PROCLAMATION, For apprehending Robert Thomas Crossfield.

WEEREAS Robert Thomas Crofsfield, late of Dyers Buildings, in the Parifh of St. Andrew, Holborn, in the County of Middlefex, Surgeon, ftands charged with Sufpicion of High Treafon: We have therefore thought fit, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to iffue this Our Royal Proclamation, hereby requiring and commanding all Our loving Subjects to difcover and apprehend, and caufe to be difcovered and apprehended, the faid Robert Thomas Crofsfield, and to carry him before

fome of Our Justices of the Peace, or Chief Magiftrates of the County, Town or Place where he fhall be apprehended, who are refpectively required to fecure him, and thereof to give fpeedy Notice unto Our Privy Council, or one of Our Principal Secretaries of State, to the End he may be forthcoming and may be dealt withal, and proceeded against according to Law. And whoever shall discover and apprehend the faid Robert Thomas Crofsfield, and bring him before fuch Justice of the Peace or Chief Magistrate, or fo discover him that he may be apprchended, shall receive for Reward the Sum of TWO HUNDRED POUNDS; which faid Sum o Two Hundred Pounds the Lords Commissioners of Our Treasury are hereby required and directed to pay accordingly. Given at Our Court at St. James's, the Twenty-feventh Day of February, in the Thirtyfifth Year of Our Reign.
