HIS Day the Lords being met, a Meffage was fent to the Honourable Houfe of Commons by Sir Francis Molyneux, Knt. Gentleman Uther of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that The Lords, amborized by wirtue of His Majefty's Commission for declaring His Royal Affent to Several Acis agreed upon by both Houfes, do defire the immediate Attendance of this Honourable Houfe in the Houfe of Peers, to hear the Commission read ; and the Commons being come thither, the faid Commission, impowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Affent to the faid Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Affent given to

An Act for raifing the Sum of Eighteen Millions by Way of Annuities. An Act for granting to His Majesty additional Du-

ties of Excipe on Foreign Wine and Sweets.

An AA for granting to His Majefty additional Du-ties of Excife on Ten, Coffee and Coroa Nuts.

An Act for granting to His Kinjeft) additional Du-ties of Excile on Worts, Wash and other Liquors made in England for extracting Spirits for Home Confimption; and for preventing Difillers from making Uje of Wheat or Wheat Flour in making Wash for extracting Spirits.

An AI for granting to His Majefty additional Duties of Excipt on Foreign Spirits.

An Act for procuring a Supply of Men from the feveral Ports of this Kingdom for the Service of His Mujefty's Navy.

An Act for appointing Commissioners to put in Execution an AA of this Sejion of Parliament, intituled, An AA for graving an Aid to His Majefty by a Land Tax to be raifed in Great Britain for the Service of the Year One Thousand Seven Hundred and Ninety-five, together with these named in Two former Asts for appointing Commifficners of the Land Tax.

SIR.

Beg you will acquaint the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, that, Half an Hour past Ten o'Clock this Morning, I brought the French Frigate La Tourterille, of 30 Guns and 250 Men, to Action; and, at Half pait One o'Clock, I had the Satisfaction to fee her furrender to His Majefly's Satisfaction to the ner turrender to this Walenty's Ship Lively, under my Command.—Our Lofs is very trilling for to long an Action, only Two Men **FP** wounded.—I am forry to fay I fear Mr. Loftus Of way Bland, the Third Lieutenant, is likely to late his Left Eye, and the Service thereby deprived of a deferving young Officer. I beg Leave to recommend to their Lordfhips
