*Westminster, March 27.*

**T**HIS Day the Lords being met, a Message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by Sir Francis Molyneux, Knt. Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorized by virtue of His Majesty's Commission for declaring His Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate Attendance of this Honourable House in the House of Peers, to bear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named; to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to*

*An Act for raising a certain Sum of Money by Loans or Exchequer Bills for the Service of the Year One thousand seven hundred and ninety-five.*

*An Act for raising a further Sum of Money by Loans or Exchequer Bills for the Service of the Year One thousand seven hundred and ninety-five.*

*An Act for granting to His Majesty the Sum of Two Hundred Thousand Pounds, to be issued and paid to the Governor and Company of the Bank of England, to be by them placed to the Account of the Commissioners for the Reduction of the National Debt.*

*An Act for granting certain Duties of Customs on the Importation of Fruit, Sallad Oil, Waste Silk and Timber, and on the Exportation of British Rock Salt and Coal.*

*An Act for rendering more effectual an Act of the present Session of Parliament, intituled, An Act for raising a certain Number of Men in the several Counties in England for the Service of His Majesty's Navy.*

*An Act for making and maintaining a Turnpike Road from Mump's Brock, within Oldham, in the*

*County Palatine of Lancaster, to Ripponden in the West Riding of the County of York; and a Branch thereof from at or near Denbaw to or near to Brownbill; and another Branch thereof from at or near Grains to Delph, all within Saddleworth in the said Riding.*

*An Act for repairing and widening the Road from Horseley Upright Gate leading from Bowden Hill, in the County of Wilts, to the Top of Kingsdown Hill, in the Parish of Box in the said County, and several other Roads near or adjoining thereto.*

*An Act for repairing and widening the Road from Preston Candover to Basingstoke in the County of Southampton, and from thence to Alton in the said County.*

And to Eight Private Bills.

The King has been pleased to grant the Dignity of a Baronesse of the Kingdom of Great Britain unto the Right Honorable Susanna Baronesse Hood, of the Kingdom of Ireland, by the Name, Stile and Title of Baronesse Hood, of Catherington in the County of Southampton, and the Dignity of a Baron of this Kingdom to the Heirs Male of her Body lawfully begotten by the Right Hon. Samuel Baron Hood, of the said Kingdom of Ireland, Admiral of the Blue.

The King has been pleased to grant unto the Hon. William Hay, of Etal in the County of Northumberland, and his Issue, His Royal Licence and Authority to take and use the Surname and bear the Arms of Carr only, pursuant to the last Will and Testament of his Maternal Grandfather Sir William Carr, of Etal aforesaid, Baronet, deceased; such Arms being first duly exemplified according to the Laws of Arms, and recorded in the Heralds Office: And also to order that this His Majesty's Concession and Declaration be registered in His College of Arms.
