Board of Green Cloth, St. James's, March 21, 1795.

'By HIS MAJESTY's Command, RDERED, That no Coaches (those of the Royal Family excepted) be admitted into any of the Courts of His Majesty's Palace at St. James's on the Night of the Nuptials of His Royal Highness the .Prince of Wales, or on the Day of the Drawing-Room ensuing.

And that all Chairs do come in at the Gate in Gleveland-Row, from whence they are to proceed through the Green Cloth Court to the Bar at the Passage leading to the Great Court, where they are to fet down, and return through the Piazza under the Ball-Room into the other Courts, where they are to attend, being placed in Order.

The Footmen attending Chairs are to wait in the Green Cloth Court, ranging themselves en each Side the Broad Pavement, so as to leave Room for the Chairs to pass.

His Majesty's Serjeant Porter, Yeoman and Groom Porters, and Marshal-Men, are strictly required to put these Orders in Execution, and to take into their · Custody all Persons who shall offend against the same, or behave in an indecent or riotous Manner. Such Offenders will be proceeded against in the most exemplary Manner.

It is farther ordered, That the Serjeant Porter, Yeoman and Groom Porters, and Marshal-Men, do fhut all the Gates and Avenues to the Palace, upon the first Notice that the Procession is coming from the Apartments to the Chapel, and that they take particular Care that no Servants come within any of the Bars. DORSET.

N. B. All Coaches are to come up to the Great Gate, with the Horses Heads towards Pall-Mall. No Coaches will be permitted to go into Cleveland Row after having fet down.

Dublin Cafile, March 31.

The Earl Camden, who embarked on Board His Majesty's Yacht the Dorset at Holyhead about Five o'Clock Yesterday Evening, arrived in this Harbour at Three o'Clock this Evening. His Lordship, on his Arrival in Dublin, was received by the Lord Mayor, Aldermen, Sheriffs and Commons of the City of Dublin. The Infantry in the Garrison lined the Streets through which his Lordship, attended by a Squadron of Dragoon Guards, proceeded to the Castle, and upon his Arrival there, at Six o'Clock. he was introduced in Form to the Lords Justices, who received him under the Canopy of State in the Presence Chamber, from whence a Procession was made in the usual State to the Council Chamber. The Council sitting, his Lordship's Commission was read, and the Oaths being administered to him, his Excellency was invested with the Collar of the Most Illustrious Order of St. Patrick, and received the Sword from the Lords Justices. The Great Guns in His Majesty's Phœnix Park were then fired, and answered by Vollies from the Regiments on Duty. His Excellency afterwards repaired to the Presence Chamber, and received the Compliments of the Nobility and other Persons of Distinction upon his safe Arrival, and taking upon him the Government of this Kingdom.
