Our Gracious Queen Charlotte, Their Royal Highnesses George Prince of Wales, the Princesses of Wales, and all the Royal Family.

And His Majesty doth strictly charge and command, That no Edition of the Common Prayer be from henceforth printed but in the Form aforementioned; and that in the mean Time, and until Copies of such Edition may be had, all Parsons, Vicars and Curates within this Realm, do (for the preventing of Mistakes) with the Pen, correct and amend all such

Prayers in their Church Books, according to the foregoing Direction: And, for the better Notice hereof, that this Order be forthwith printed and published, and sent to the several Parishes; and that the Right Reverend the Bishops do take Care that Obedience be paid to the same accordingly.
