

Whitehall, April 25, 1795.

Whereas it has been humbly represented to the King, that several inflammatory and seditious Hand-Bills were, on the 9th, 10th, 11th and 12th Instant, dispersed and stuck up in several public Places in the Towns of Crediton and Ashburton, in the County of Devon, inciting Riots and Tumults amongst the Labourers and others of the said Towns.

His Majesty, for the better apprehending and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in writing and dispersing the said Hand-Bills, or either of them, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any One of them, (except the Person or Persons who were actually the Authors thereof) who shall discover his, her or their Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he, she or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.

And, as a further Encouragement, a Reward of ONE HUNDRED POUNDS is hereby offered by the Magistrates of the County of Devon to any Person or Persons making such Discovery as aforesaid (except as before excepted) upon the Conviction of any One or more of the Offenders, to be paid by the Treasurer of the said County.
