

every Able and Ordinary Seaman, fit to serve on board His Majesty's Ships, should be paid to any Person who should discover any Seaman or Seamen who might conceal him or themselves, so that such Seaman or Seamen should be taken for His Majesty's Service, on or before the Thirtieth Day of April then next, by any of His Majesty's Sea Officers appointed to raise Men on Shore, or by the Captains or Commanders of any of His Majesty's Ships or Vessels in the Ports or on the Coasts of this Kingdom: And whereas the Time limited by the said Proclamations for Payment of the said Bounties and Reward, hath been prolonged and extended to the Thirtieth Day of this instant April; and it being judged expedient for His Majesty's Service that the said Bounties and Reward should be continued to be paid for some Time longer; His Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby accordingly ordered, that the Time limited for Payment of the said Bounties and Reward be prolonged and extended, from the said Thirtieth Day of this instant April, to the Thirtieth Day of June next inclusive: Whereof all Persons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themselves accordingly.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HIS Majesty having been pleased to appoint Richard Earl of Mount Edgcumbe to be Lord Lieutenant of the County of Cornwall, his Lordship this Day took the Oaths appointed to be taken thereupon, instead of the Oaths of Allegiance and Supremacy.

Westminster, April 28.

THIS Day the Lords being met, a Message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by Sir Francis Molyneux, Knt. Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that The Lords, authorized by virtue of His Majesty's Commission for declaring His Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate Attendance of this Honourable House in the House of Peers, to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

An Act for granting to His Majesty several additional Duties on stamped Vellum, Parchment and Paper, and for repealing a certain Exception as far as relates to Bonds given as Security for the Payment of One Hundred Pounds, or under, contained in an Act of the Twenty-third Year of His present Majesty's Reign.

An Act for granting Annuities to satisfy certain Navy and Victualling Bills.

An Act for enabling His Majesty to raise the Sum of Two Millions Five Hundred Thousand Pounds, for the Uses and Purposes therein mentioned.

An Act for granting to His Majesty a certain Sum of Money, to be raised by a Lottery.

An Act to continue several Laws relating to the granting a Bounty on certain Species of British and Irish Linens exported, and taking off the Duties on the Importation of Foreign Raw Linen Yarns made of Flax; to the discontinuing the Duties payable on the Importation of Tallow, Hogs Lard and Grease; and to the prohibiting the Importation of Foreign wrought Silks and Velvets; and for making perpetual an Act made in the Twenty-fifth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, to prohibit the Exportation of Tools and Utensils made Use of in the Iron and Steel Manufactures of this Kingdom, and to prevent the seducing of Artificers or Workmen employed in these Manufactures, to go into Parts beyond the Seas.

An Act further to continue an Act made in the Thirtieth Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, An Act for establishing Regulations respecting Aliens arriving in this Kingdom, or resident therein, in certain Cases.

An Act to continue the Laws now in Force for regulating the Trade between the Subjects of His Majesty's Dominions, and the Inhabitants of the Territories
