PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

7HEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Order in Council of the 5th of November left, prohibiting the transporting into any Parts out of this Kingdom any Pct Afh or Pearl Afh (except as in the faid Order is mentioned) will expire upon the 7th Day of this inftant May : And whereas it is judged expedient that the faid Prohibition fhould be continued for fome Time longer; His Majefly doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit and command, that no Person or Persons whatsoever do, at any Time, during the Space of Six Months from the faid 7th Day of this inflant May, export, or attempt to export, transport, carry or convey, or lade or lay on Eoard of any Ship, Veffel or Boat, in order to be exported, transported, carried or conveyed out of this Kingdom, any Pot Afh or Pearl Afh, without Leave or Permiffion being fift had and obtained from His Majefty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Eorfeitures inflicted by an Act passed in the last Session of Parliament, intituled, " An Act for indemnifying all Perfons who have * been concerned in adviling or carrying into Exe-" cution an Order of the Lords Commissioners of " His Majelty's Treasury respecting the Exporta-* tion of Pot Afhes or Pearl Afhes ; for preventing

" Suits in confequence of the fame ; for authorizing " His Majefly to prohibit the Exportation or car-" rying Coaftwife of Pot Alhes or Pearl Alhes, and " for making further Provisions relative thereto." But it is neverthelefs His Majefty's Pleafure, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be confirued to extend, to prevent the Exportation of the faid Articles to Ireland, or to His Majeily's Islands of Guernfey, Jerfey, Alderney, Sark or Man, or to His Majesty's Colonies or Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majefly's Forts and Settlements on the Coaft of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies; provided that, upon the Exportation of the faid Articles to Ireland, or to His Majefty's Iflands of Guernfey, Jerfey, Alderney, Sark or Man, or to His Majesty's Colonies and Plantations in America or the Weft Indies, or to the Island of Newfoundland, or to His Majelty's Forts and Settlements on the Coaft of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies, the Exporters of the faid Articles do first make Oath of the true Defination of the fame to the Places for which they shall be entered Outwards, before the Entry of the same shall be made, a.d do give full and fufficient Security, by Bond, to the Satisfaction of the Commiffioners of His Majefty's Cuftoms, to carry the faid Articles to the Places for which they are fo entered Outwards, and none other other; and fuch Bond shall not be cancelled or delivered op until Proof be made, to the Satisfaction of the faid Commissioners, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the faid Commiffioners, and specified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in fuch Form and Manner as fhall be directed by the faid Commiffioners, fhewing that the faid Articles hav been duly landed at the Places for which they were entered Outwards. "The KING's Molt Excellent Majefty in Council. HEREAS His Majefty was pleafed, by His Order in Council, bearing Date the 6th of February last, to order, and it was thereby ordered, That notwithstanding any Thing contained in Two Acts passed in the last Session of Parliament, referred to in the faid Order, it should be lawful for any Person, refiding or being in Great Britain, to pay any Bill drawn or indorfed in any Part of the United Provinces, and fent from the faid Prowinces on or before the Sixteenth Day of January laft; provided fuch Bill should have been made payable at no greater Diftance of Time than Three Months from the Date thereof, or Three Months from Sight thereof, under certain Conditions in the faid Order contained :- His Majefty, with the Advice of his Privy Council, is hereby pleafed to order, That the Licence, fo granted by the above recited Order of the Sixth of February laft, with respect to the Payment of the Bills therein described, be extended, subject to the Condition mentioned in the faid Order, to any Bills, drawn or indorfed in any Part of the United Provinces, and fent from the faid Provinces, on or before the faid Sixteenth Day of January laft, which shall have been made payable at no greater Diftance of Time than Five Months from the Date thereof, or Five Months from Sight thereof.
