

WHereas feveral Lieutenants of His Majefty's Navy, now unemployed, have omitted give Information to this Office of the Places of their Refidence, notwithitanding the Notice inferted in the London Gazette in the Months of November and December last; It is the Direction of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, that fuch Lieutenants do, within the Space of Six Weeks from this Date. or fooner, if possible, transmit to this Office the Information required, and that fuch of them as are incapable, either from Age or bodily Infirmity, of further Service, do, at the fame Time transmit an Affidavit from a Qualified Surgeon, of fuch Inability, specifying therein the Cause or Causes thereof, that their Lordinios may judge how far it may be proper to call for the further Services of fuch Lieutenants.

In cafe the fame Difregard should be paid to this. as hath been fhewn to the former Notice, it is their Lordships Intention to mark their Disapprobation of the Conduct of f. h Officers in the ftrongett Manner, by striking their Names off the List of Lieutenants of His Majesty's Navy.

General Post-Office, May 6, 1795. B^{r} an AA passed in the present Session of Parliament, intituled, " An Act for further regulating " the finding and receiving Letters free from the Duty of Postage; for allowing Non-commissioned Officers, " Seamen, and Private Men, in the Navy and Army, " whilst on Service, to fend and receive Letters at a "I low Rate of Postage; and for permitting Patterns "and Samples of Goods to be transmitted by the Post "at an easter Rate than is now allowed by Law,"

No Letter or Packet whatfoever, fent by the Poll within Great firitain, directed by or to any Mem ber of either House of Parliament of Great-Bristain, shall, from and after the 5th Instant, be exempted from the Duty of Postage, if fuch Letter or Package shall exceed One Ounce in Weight.

No Letter or Packet directed by any fuch Member, shall be exempted from the Postage, unless the Member whole Name shall be inderied thereon, shall actually be in the Post Town into the Post-"Office of which every fuch Letter or Packet shall be put, or within the Limits of the Delivery of Letters for fuch Post Town, or within Twenty Miles of fuch Post Town, on the Day, or on the Day before the Day on which fuch Letter or Packet shall be put into the Post-Office. No fuch Member shall be entitled or allowed to

fend by the Poft, free from Poltage, fuperferined or directed by him, more than Ten Letters in any One Day, nor to receive by the Poft, free from Postage, more than Fifteen Letters directed to him in any One Day.

Provided, that whenever the Number of Letters or Packets, not weighing more than One Ounce each, fent or received by any fuch Member in any One Day, shall exceed the Number exempted by the faid Act from Pollage, and the Rate of Pollage upon any of them thall differ, then fuch of the faid Letters or Packets as would be chargeable with a higher Rate of Postage than the Remainder, shall be included in the Number io exempted, in Preference to any which would be chargeable with I

B

a lower Rate of Poftage, and the Remainder fhall be chargeable with the feveral Rates of Poftage respectively to which such Letters would now by Law be chargeable, if fent or received by any Perfons not entitled to fend or receive Letters or Packets free from Poftage.

The feveral Perfons who by Law are authorifed in Right of their Offices and Employments to fend and receive Letters free from Postage, and their Succeffors in fuch Offices and Employments, may, during their Continuance in fuch Offices and Employments, fend and receive Letters and Packets. free from Postage, as they now fend and receive the fame.

No printed Votes or Proceedings in Parliament, or printed Newspapers sent without Covers, or in Covers open at the Sides which shall be figned on the Outlide thereof by the Hand of any Member of Parliament as heretofore practifed, or which shall be directed to any fuch Member at any Place whereof he shall have given Notice in Writing to the Postmaster-General, or his Deputy, shall be charged with Poflage.

No fingle Letter fent by the Poft from any Noncommissioned Officer, Seaman, or Private employed in His Majelly's Navy, Army, Militia, Fencille Regiments, Artillery or Marines, fhall, whilt fuch Non-commissioned Officer, Seaman or Private shall be employed on His Majetly's Service, and not otherwife, be charged with an higher Rate of Poftage than the Sum of One Penny for the Conveyance of each fuch Letter, fuch Postage to be paid at the Time of putting the fame into the Post-Office of the Town or Place from whence fuch Letter is intended to be fent by the Post.

Provided, that no fuch Letter shall be exempted from Pollage unless there shall be written theiron in the Hand-Writing of and figned by the Commanding Officer for the Time being of the Ship or Vesicl, or of the Corps, Regiment, or Detach-ment to which such Non-commissioned Officer, Seaman, or Private shall belong, the Name of such Commanding Officer, and of the Ship, Vessel, Corps, Regment or Detachment commanded by h m.

No fingle Letter, directed to any fuch Noncommissioned Officer, Seaman or Private, upon his own private Concerns, only whilft fuch Non-commissioned Officer, Seaman or Private shall be employed on His Majefty's Service, and not otherwife, shall be charged with an higher Rate of Poltage than One Penny for each fuch Letter, which Penny thall be paid at the Time of the Delivery thereof,
