

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. HEREAS by an Act made in the Twentythird Year of the Reign of His present Majefty, intituled, " An Act for preventing certain " Inflruments from being required from Ships " belonging to the United States of America; " and to give to His Majefty, for a limited " Time, certain Powers for the better carrying " on Trade and Conimerce between the Subjects " of His Majefly's Dominions and the Inhabitants " of the faid United States ;" which faid Act has been continued by feveral fublequent Afis until the 5th Day of April, 1797. And whereas by an Act made in the Twenty-fourth Year of His prefent Majesty's Reign, intituled, " An A& to extend the * Powers of an ASt, made in the Twenty-third Year " of the Reign of His prefent Majefly, for giving " His Majefty certain Powers for the better carrying " on Trade and Commerce between the Subjects of " His Majefly's Dominions and the Inhabitants " of the United States of America, to the Trade st and Commerce of this Kingdom with the British * Colonies and Plantations in America, with re-" fpect to certain Articles therein mentioned," the Powers given by the faid recited Act were extended to the Trade and Intercourfe between this Kingdom and the British Colonies and Plantations in America, fo far as the fame might relate to

Iron, Hemp and Sailcloth, and other Articles of the Produce of any Place bordering on the Baltic, which might be exported from this Kingdom; which last mentioned Act has also by several subfequent Acts been continued until the faid 5th Day of April, 1795.

And whereas by another Act passed in this prefent Seffion of Parliament, intituled, "An Act to continue " the Laws now in Force for regulating the Trade be-" tween the Subjects of His Majefty's Dominions " and the Inhabitants of the Territories belonging " to the United States of America, fo far as the " same relate to the Trade and Commerce carried " on between this Kingdom and the Inhabitants " of the Countries belonging to the faid United " States," it is declared to be expedient, that the faid A& of the Twenty-third Year of His prefent Majefty's Reign, fo far only as the fame extends to the Trade and Commerce carried on between this Kingdom and the People and Territories belonging to the United States of America, and alfo that the faid Act of the Twenty-fourth Year of His prefent Majefty's Reign, flould be further continued and be in Force; and it is thereby enacted, that the faid Ads fhall continue and be in Force until the 5th Day of April, 1796, and to the End of the then next Seffion of Parliament:

His Majety doth thereupon, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order and declare, That any Unmanufactured Goods and Merchandizes, the Importation of which into this Kingdom
