Sark or Man, or to His Majelly's Colonies and Planstations in America or the West Indies, or to the Island of Newfoundland, or to His Majelly's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Afland of St. Helena, or the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies, the Exporters of the faid Wood called Lignum Vitæ do first make Oath of the true Defination of the fame to the Places for which it shall be entered Outwards, before the Entry of the fame shall be made, and do give full and fufficient Security, by Bond, to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majelty's Customs, to carry the faid Wood called Lignum Vitæ to the Places for which it is fo entered Outwards, and none other; and fuch Bond shall not be cancelled or delivered up until Proof be made, to the Satisfaction of the faid Commissioners, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the faid Commillioners, and Specified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in fuch Form and Manner as shall be directed by the faid Commissioners, shewing that the faid Wood called Lignum Vitæ has been duly landed at the Places for which it was entered Outwards. And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majefty's Treafury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

T7 HEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the 3d of December laft, for prohibiting the Exportation out of this Kingdom, or carrying Coastwife, Gunpowder or Salt-Pere, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, will expire upon the 7th Day of this inflant June : And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majefty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the aid Prohibition should be continued for some Time, Jonger; His Majefty doth therefore, hy and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit and command, that no Perfon or Perfons whatfoever (except the Mafter-General of -the Ordnance for His Majefty's Service) do, at any Time during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the faid 7th Day of this inflant June, prefume to transport, into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coasswife, any Gunpowder or Salt-Retre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or thip

or lade any Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, on board any Ship or Veffel, in order to transporting the fame into any Parts beyond the Seas, or carrying the fame Coaftwife, without Leave or Permission in that Behalf first obtained from His Majefty, or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring and fuffering the respective Forfeitures and Penalties inflicted by an Act passed in the Twenty-ninth Year of His late Majefty's Reign, intituled. " An Act to impower His Majefty to pro-" hibit the Exportation of Salt-Petre, and to enforce " the Law for impowering His Majefly to prohibit " the Exportation of Gunpowder, or any Sort of " Arms or Ammunition ; and alfo to empower His Majefty to reftrain the carrying Coaftwife of Salt-" Petre, Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Am-" munition :"-And the Lords Commissioners of His Majefty's Treafury, the Commiffioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General of the Ordnance, and His Majefty's Secretary at War, are to give the neceffary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.
