fage was fent to the Honourable House of Commons by Mr. Quarme, the Yeoman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that The Lords, authorized by virtue of His Majesty's Commission for declaring His Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate Attendance of this Honourable House in the House of Pars, to bear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, impowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent given to

An Ast for granting to His Majesty a certain Sum of Money out of the Consolidated Fund, for the Service of the Year One thousand seven hundred hundred and ninety-sive; and for further appropriating the Supplies granted in this Session of Parliament.

An Ast for preventing the Accumulation of Debts by any future Heir Apparent of the Crown; and for regulating the Mode of Expenditure, from the Time when a separate Establishment shall be made for such suture Heir Apparent.

An Act to prohibit, for a limited Time, the making of Low Wines or Spirits from Wheat, Barley, Male, or any other Sort of Grain, or from any Mical, Flour, or Bran; and for permitting Homemade Spirits, deposited in the Warehouses for Expartation, to be taken out for Home Confumption, on Payment of Duty. An Act for allowing the Importation of Rape Seed, and other Seeds used for extracting Oil, from any Country whatever, whenever the Prices of middling British Rape Seed shall be above a certain Limit.

An Act for allowing further Time for Persons to take out Certificates for using or wearing Hair Powder, in pursuance of an Act of this present Session of Parliament, intituled, An Act for granting to His Majesty a Duty on Certificates issued for using Hair Powder; and also surther Time for the Admeasurement and Registering of Boats, Barges, and other Vessels, in pursuance of another Act of the same Session, intituled, An Act for requiring all Boats, Barges, and other Vessels, of certain Descriptions, used on Navigable Rivers and on Inland Navigations, in Great Britain, to be registered:

An Act for better securing the Duties on Glass. An Act for repealing so much of an Act of Parliament, passed in the Twenty-ninth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled, An Act for granting to His Majesty several additional Rates and Duties upon Hosses and Carriages with Four Wheels; and for explaining and amending an Act, passed in the Twenty-fifth Year of His present Majesty, as far as relates to certain Carriages with Two or Three Wheels therein mentioned, as relates to the additional Duties upon Coaches with Four Wheels, used as Stage Coaches; and for reducing the Duties upon Carriages with less than Four Wheels, mostly used in the Assairs of Husbandry, or for the Purposes of Trade.

An Act to amend an Act, made in the Thirty-fecond Year of the Reign of His prefent Majetty, intituled, An Act for regulating the Allowance of the Drawback and Payment of the Bounty on the Exportation of Sugar; and for permitting the Image portation of Sugar and Coffee into the Bahama and Bermuda Islands, in Foreign Ships; and for redu-
