May that auspicious Event contribute to the Increase of your Majesty's domestic Felicity and to that of your Royal Consort our gracious Queen; and may the inestimable Blessings, which these Kingdoms have hitherto enjoyed under the mild and liberal Government of the illustrious House of Brunswick, be transmitted to the latest Posterity through a long Succession of Princes descended from your Majesty, and Inheritors of those Royal Virtues which have so deservedly gained your Majesty the Admiration and Affection of all your Subjects.
