

DUTCH PROPERTY ACT.

WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament of the Thirteenth of His Majesty, entitled, "An Act to make further Provision respecting Ships and Effects come into this Kingdom, to take the Benefit of His Majesty's Orders in Council of the 16th and 21st Days of January, 1793; and to provide for the Disposal of other Ships and Effects, detained in or brought into the Ports of this Kingdom, &c. &c. &c."

And whereas the said Act empowers His Majesty, by and with the Advice of his Privy Council, to appoint Commissioners to take Possession and to dispose of the Ships and Cargoes which may be detained or brought into the Kingdom: And whereas, by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal of Great Britain, bearing Date the 13th Day of this present Month, James Crawford, John Brackwood, Allen Chatfield, John Bowles and Alexander Baxter, Esqrs: are appointed Commissioners according to the said Act.

Notice is hereby given, that the aforesaid Commissioners, appointed under the said Act, are ready to receive, in Writing, the Claims of all Persons, in respect of any Ship or Vessel, or of any Cargo, Goods, Wares or Merchandise, being the Property of the Subjects of His Majesty, or of any Country in Amity with His Majesty, and not of the People of the United Provinces, that have been detained in or brought into the Ports of this Kingdom. And all Persons having any Demands against such Ships or Cargoes, are required to deliver in an Account thereof to the above named Commissioners.
