AT the Court at St. James's, the E7th of June, 1795,

P Е R E S N Т, The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. 7 HEREAS His Majefty was graciously pleafed, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Twenty-fixth Day of December, 1792, to promise and declare, that the Bounties of Five Pounds for every Able Seaman, and Two Pounds Ten Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, fit for His Majelly's Service, should be paid in the Manner thereby directed to every fuch Able and Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should, on or before the Twenty-eighth Day of February then following, enter themfelves to ferve in His Majesty's Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of His Majefty's Ships or Veffels, or Officers employed on Shore for raifing Men for the Service of the Royal Navy: And whereas His Majefty was also graciously pleased, by His faid Proclamation, to declare, that all Able-bodied Landmen, not above the Age of Thirty-five nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should fo enter themfelves as aforefaid, fhould receive the Sum of Thirty Shillings each Man, as His Majefty's Royal Bounty: And whereas His Majefty was also graciously pleased, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Sixteenth Day of the

faid Month of February, 1793, to promife and de. clare, that a Reward of Twenty Shillings for every Able and Ordinary Seaman, fit to ferve on board His Majefty's Ships, should be paid to any Perfon who should discover any Seaman or Seamen who might conceal him or themselves, fo that fuch Seaman or Seamen should be taken for His Majefty's Service, on or before the Thirtjeth Day of April then next, by any of His Majefty's Sea Officers appointed to raife Men on Shore, or by the Captains or Commanders of any of His Majefly's Ships or Veffels in the Ports or on the Coafts of this Kingdom: And whereas the Time limited by the faid Proclamations for Payment of the faid Bounties and Reward, hath been prolonged and extended to the Thirtieth Day of this instant June; and it being judged expedient for His Majefty's Service that the faid Bounties and Reward fhculd be continued to be paid for fome Time longer; His Majefty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby accordingly ordered, that the Time limited for Payment of the faid Bounties and Reward be prolonged and extended, from the faid Thirtieth Day of this inftant June, to the Thirty-first Day of August next inclusive : Whereof all Perons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themfelves accordingly.

A T the Court at St. James's, the 10th of June, 1795, P R E S E N T,

The KING's Most Excelient Majesty in Council. VI THEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Order in Council of the 10th Day of December, 1794, prohibiting the transporting into any Parts out of this Kingdom any of the Wood cailed Lignum Viræ, is about to expire : And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majefly's Service that the faid Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer; His Majefly doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit and command, that no Perfon or Perfons wholeever do, at any Time, for the Space of Six Months from the Date hereof, export, or attempt te export, transport, carry or convey, or lade or lay ou Dourd of any Ship, Veffel or Boat, in order to be exported, transported, carried or conveyed out of his Kingdom, any of the Wood called Lignum Vitæ, without Leave or Permiffion being first had and obtained from His Majefty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by an Act passed in the Thirty-fourth Year of His Majefty's Reign, intituled, " An Act for indemnifying . " all Perfons who have been concerned in advising " or carrying into Execution an Order of the Lords " Commissioners of Lis Majefty's Treasury respect-" ing the Exportation of Pot Afhes or Pearl Afhes; '" for preventing Suits in confequence of the fame ; " for authorizing His Majelly to prohibit the Ex-. " partation or carrying Coaftwife of Pot Affres or " Pearl Alhes, and for making further Provisions " relative thereto." But it is neverthelefs His Majeily's Pleafure, that nothing herein contained fhall extend, or be confirued to extend, to prevent any Ship or Veffel from taking or having on Board any of the faid Wood called Lignum Vitæ, which may be neceffary for the Use of the faid Ship or Vessel during the Courfe of her intended Voyage, nor to prevent the Exportation of the faid Wood called Lignum Vitæ to Ireland, or to His Majerty's Islands of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark or Man, or to His Majefty's Colonies or Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majefty's Forts and Settlements on the Coaft of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies; provided that, upon the Exportation of the faid Wood called Lignum Vitæ to Ireland, or to His Majefty's Iflands of Guernley, Jerley, Alderney, Sark or Man, or to His Majefly's Colonies and Planrations in America or the Well Indies, or to the Island of Newfoundland, or 10 His Majesty's Forts

and Settlements on the Coaft of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indics, the Exporters of the faid Wood called Lignum Vitæ do first make Oath of the true Defination of the fame to the Places for which it shall be entered Outwards, before the Entry of the fame fhall be made, and do give full and fufficient Security, by Bond, to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, to carry the faid Wood called Lignum Vitæ to the Places for which it is fo entered Outwards, and none other; and fuch Bond shall not be cancelled or delivered up until Proof be made, to the Satisfaction of the faid Commissioners, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the faid Comm Goners, and specified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in fuch Form and Manner 2s fliall be directed by the faid Commissioners, shewing that the faid Wood called Lignum Vitæ has been duly landed at the Places for which it was entered Outwards. And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majefty's Treafuty, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord Warden of the Cirque Ports, are to give the neceffary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty.

THEREAS the Time limited by His Majefly's Order in Council of the 3d of December laß, for prohibiting the Exportation out of this Kirgdom, or carrying Coaftwife, Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, will expire upon the 7th Day of this inftant June : And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majefty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, the the faid Prohibition flould be continued for fome Time, longer; Pis Majefty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit and command, that no Perfon or Perfons whatfoever (except the Mafter-General of the Ordnance for His Mejefty's Service) do, at any Time during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the faid 7th Day of this inftant June, prefume to transport, into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coastwife, any Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or thip or lade any Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, on board any Ship or Venel, in order to mansporting the same into any parts beyond the Seas, or carrying the fame Cost one, without obtained from Eis Majeny, or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring and fuffering the respective Forfaitures and Penalties inflicted, by an Act paffed in the Twenty-ninth Year of His late Majefty's Reign, intituled, " An Act to impower His Majefty to pro-" hibit the Exportation of Salt-Petre, and to enforce " the Law for impowering His Majefty to prohibit " the Exportation of Gunpowder, or any Sort of " Arms or Ammunition; and allo to empower His " Majely to reftrain the carrying Coaffwife of Salt-" Petre, Gunnowder, or any Sort of Arms or Am-" munition :"-And the Lords Commiffioners of His Majefty's Treafury, the Commiffiners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Hord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Matter-General of the Ordnance, and His Majeiv's Secretary at War, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively apportain.

Mies King George the First and Second and of Lis refeat Mojuly, for preventing fach Practices, 2 are pullified; for the Information of all Perfons nubo ny be ignorant of the Penalties they may incur by D'I redience to them And it will be ab erwed, that fich Penalties likewife extend to thefe who are any ways concerned or instrumental in the Sending - or Entiting. Artificers or Manufa Turers out of thefe Mingdoms, or in the Expandetion of the Tools and Influments used by them, as well as to the Artifi-. cers or Manufasturers ihemfeltier.

Statute 5 George I. Chap. 27. ...

Artificer in Wool, Iron; Steel, Brafs, or offer Metal, Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Atificer of Great Britain, to go into Foreign Countries. cut of the King's Dominions, and thall be convicted thereof, upon Indictment or Informa-aton in any of the Courts at Westminiter, or at the Allizes or Quarter-Seffions, he fhall be fined any Sum nor exceeding ONE HUNDRED POUNDS for the first Offence, and shall be imprifoned Three Wonths, and till the Fine be paid. And if any Ferfon having been once convicted shall offend again he frell be fined at the Diferection of the Court, and imprifoned Twelve Months, and till the Fine be paid.

. If any of the King's Subjects, being fuch Artificers, fiail go into any Country out of His Majesty's Dominions, to exercise or teach the faid Trades to Eoreigners; and if any of the King's

without Leave or Permifion in that Behalf first Subjects in any fuch Foreign Country, enerciding Realm within Six Months after Warning given by the An baffador, Minister or Conful of Great Britain, in the Country where fuch Artificers shall be or by any Perlon authorised by fuch Ambaslador, Sc. cr by one of the Secretaries of State, and from henceforth inhabit within this Realm ; fuch Perfons shall be incapable of taking any Legacy, or of being an Executor or Administrator, or of taking any Laads, &c. within this Kingdom, by Defcent, De-vife or Purchafe, and shall forfeit all Lands, Goods, &c. within this Kingdom, to His Majefty's Ufe, and shall be deemed Alien, and out of His Majefty's Protection.

Upon Complaint made, upon Oath, before any Juffice of Peace, that any Perfon is endeavour-ing to feduce any fuch Artificer, or that any fuch Artificer hath contracted or is preparing to go out of fais Majelly's Dominions, for the Purpoles aforefaid, fuch Juilice may fend his Warrant to bring the Perfon complained of before him, or before fome other Justice; and if it shall appear by the Oath of one Witness, or by Confossion. that he was guilty of any of the faid Offences, fuch Jullice may bind him to appear at the next Affizes or Quarter Seffions : And, if fuch Perion shall refuse to give Security, the Judice may commit him to Goal till the next Affizes or Quarter Sections, and until he shall ac delivered by due Courte of Law. And if any fuch artificer thall be convicted, upon Indictment, of any fuch Fiomile, Contract, or Preparation to go beyond the Seas, for the Purpole aforefaid, he shall give fuch Security to the King not to depart out of His Majefly's Dominions, as such Court Inell think realonable, and shall be imprisoned till Security given.

If any of the above Offences shall be committed in Scotland, the fame shall be protecuted in the Court of Jufficiary, or the Circuts there.

Statute 23 George 11. Chap. 13.

IF any Perfon fall contract with, or endeavout to feduce any Artificer in Wool, Mohair, Cot-ton or Silk, or in Iron, Steel, Brafs, or other Metal, or any Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Artificer in any other of the Manufactures of Great Britain or Ireland, to go out of this Kingdom or Ireland, into any Foreign Country not within the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, and shall be convicted, upon In-dictment or Information; in the King's Bench at Westminster, or by Indictment at the Alizes or General Gaol Delivery for the County, &c. wherein fuch Offence shall be committed in England, or by Indictment in the Court of Jufficiary, or any of the Circuit Courts in Scotland, or by Indictment or Information in the King's Bench at Dublin, if fuch Offence be committed in Ire-land; the Perfon fo convicted fliall, for every Artificer contracted with, or feduced, forfeit FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS, and fault fuffer Imprifonment in the Common Goal of the County or Stewartry wherein fuch Offender fhall be convicted, for Twelve Calendar Months, and until Forfeiture be paid : And in Cafe of a fublequent Offence of the fame Kind, the Perfons fo again offending fhall forfeit, for every Perion contracted with of feduced, ONE THOUSAND POUNDS, and fhall fuffer Imprifonment in the Common Gaol of the County or Stewartry wherein fuch Offender ínall

shall be convicted, for Two Years, and until fuch | Forfeiture be paid.

If any Person in Great Britain or Ireland shall put on Board any Ship or Boat, not bound directly to fome Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to fome other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, any fuch Tools or Utenfils as are commonly used in or proper for the Preparing, Working up or Finishing of the Woollen or Silk Manufactures or any Part of fuch Tools, he shall, for every Offence, forfeit all tuch Tools, or Parts thereof, put on Board, and TWO HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered by Action of Debt, &c. in any Court of Record at Weftminiter, or in the Court of Seffion in Scotland, or at any of the Four Courts in Dublin respectively, wherein no Essoin, &c. fhall be allowed.

It shall be lawful for any Officer of the Cuftoms in Great Britain, or for any Officer of the Revenue in Ireland, to feize and fecure, in fome of His Ma-Cocket or Sufferance for the Shipping or Exporting. of any of the faid Tools, or knowingly fuffer the fame to be done, he shall forfeit ONE HUNDRED FOUNDS, to be recovered as aforefaid, and alfo forfeit his Office, and be incapable of any Office. under His Majefty.

One Moiety of the Forfeitures shall be applied to the Use of His Majelly, and the other Moiety to the Ufe of the Perfon who fhall, fue for the fame.

Statutes 14, 21, 25 and 26 of His prefent Majefly. BY these Statutes the like Penalties and For-

feitures as above mentioned are extended to Perfons packing or putting on board any Veffel, jelly's Warehoufes, all fuch Tools or Utenfils prohibited to be exported, as fuch Officer shall find on Boord any Vessel not bound directly to fome Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to fome other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain ; and all Tools fo feized shall, after Condemnation, be publickly fold to the best Bidder; and one Moiety of the Produce shall be to the Use, of His Majesty, and the other Moiety to the Officer who shall feize and fecure the fame.

If the Captain of any Veffel in Great Britain or Ireland knowingly permit any of the faid Tools, prohibited to be exported, to be put on Board his Veflel, he shall, for every fuch Offence, forfeitONE HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered as the Penaltics inflicted upon Perfons exporting the Tools; and, if the Veffel belongs to His Majefly, the Cartain shall not only forfeit ONE HUN-BRED POUNDS, but shall also forfeit his Empoyment, and be incapable of any. Employment under His Majesty. If any Officer of the Customs in Great Britain,

or of the Revenue in Ireland, take, or knowingly uffer to be taken, any Entry outward, or fign any not bound directly for fome Port in Great Britain or Ireland, any. Machine, Engine, Tool, Prefs, Paper, Utenfil or Implement whatfoever, ufed, in or proper for the working or finishing of the Cotton, Linen, Steel or Iron Manufactures of this Kingdom, or any Part or, Parts of fuch Machines or Implements; or any Models, or, Plans thereof; and all Captains of Ships, and other, Perfons, receiving or being in Poffellion of any fuch Articles, with an Intent to export the fame to Foreign Rear Admiraly. One-Ditto-Ditto.

Parts, and all Cuffom-house Officers suffering an Entry to be made thereof, are respectively liable to the like l'enalties as are above mentioned, in the Cafe of Tools and Utenfils used in the Woollen and Silk Manufactures.
