A7HEREAS it has been reprefented to His Majefty at this Board, that the malignant and contagious Fever, of the Nature of the Plague, which fome Time fince manifested itself at Baltimore an the State of Maryland, has ceafed : His Majefty, taking the fame into Confideration, and being defirous to remove all Restraints upon Trade, fo far as may be confiftent with the Safety of His Subjects, is pleafed, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Quarantice, laid by His Majefty's Order in Council, bearing Date the 12th Day of November, 1794, upon all Ships, Veffels, Perfons, Goods and Merchandize, now arrived, or that shall hereafter arrive from Baltimore, or any other Port or Place in the faid State of Maryland, in the United States of America, be taken off; and that all fuch Ships and Veffels he permitted to discharge their respective Ladings, without unpacking, opening and airing, and without performing any Quarantine, as freely as they might have done, in cafe fuch Order of the 12th Day of November, 1794, had not been made, any Thing in the faid Order contained to the contrary notwithstanding; provided that the Masters or other Perfons, having Charge of fuch Ships or Veflels refpectively, do first make Oath, before the Custom-House Officer of Chief Magistrate as the Places respectively

Officers employed on Shore for raining Men for the Service of the Royal Navy: And whereas His Majefty was also graciously pleased, by His faid Proclamation, to declare, that all Able-bodied Landmen, not above the Age of Thirty-five nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should fo enter themselves as aforesaid, should receive the Sum of Thirty Shillings each Man, as His Majefty's Royal Bounty: And whereas His Majefly was also gracioully pleased, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Sixteenth Day of the faid Month of February, 1793, to promife and declare, that a Reward of Twenty Shillings for every Able and Ordinary Seaman, fit to ferve on board His Majefty's Ships, should be paid to any Perfon who should discover any Seaman or Seamen who might conceal him or themfelves, fo that fuch Seaman or Seamen should be taken for His Majesty's Service, on or before the Thirtieth Day of April then next, by any of His Majesty's Sea Officers appointed to raife Men on Shore, or by the Captains or Commanders of any of His Majefty's Ships or Veffels in the Ports or on the Coafts of this Kingdom : And whereas the Time limited by the faid Proclamations for Payment of the faid Bounties and Reward, hath been prolonged and extended to the Thirtieth Day of this inftant June; and it being judged expedient for His Majefty's Service that the faid Bounties and Reward should be continued to be paid for some Time longer; His Majefty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby accordingly ordered, that the Time limited for Payment of the faid Bounties and Reward be prolonged and extended, from the faid Thirtieth Day of this inftant Jone, to the Thirty-first Day of August next inclusive : Whereof all Perons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themfelves accordingly.
