P R Е S ΕNΤ, The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. 7 HEREAS it has been reprefented to His Majefty at this Board, that the malignant and contagious Fever, of the Nature of the Plague, which fome Time fince manifefted itfelf at Baltimore in the State of Maryland, has ceased : His Majesty, taking the fame into Confideration, and being defirous to remove all Restraints upon Trade, so far as may be confiftent with the Safety of His Subjects, is pleafed, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Quarantine, laid by His Majefty's Order in Council, bearing Date the 12th Day of November, 1794, upon all Ships, Vesiels, Perfons, Goods and Merchandizc, now arrived, or that shall hereafter arrive from Baltimore, or any other Port or Place in the faid State of Maryland, in the United States of America, be taken off; and that all fuch Ships and Veffels be permitted to discharge their respective Ladings, without unpacking, opening and airing, and without performing any Quarantine, as freely as they might have done, in cafe fuch Order of the 12th Day of November, 1794, had not been made, any Thing in the faid Order contained to the contrary notwithflanding ; provided that the Mafters or other Perfons, having Charge of fuch Ships or Vefiels refpectively, do first make Oath, before the Caltom-House Officer or Chief Magistrate as the Places respectively

rived, or shall arrive, that their Crews are free from all Infaction.—And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majefty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master General of the Ordnance, His Majesty's Secretary at War, and the Governors or Commanders in Chief, for the Time being, of the Isles of Jersey, Guernsey, Alderney, Sark and Man, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. THEREAS His Majefty was gracioufly pleafed, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Twenty-fixth Day of December, 1792, to promise and declare, that the Bounties of Five Pounds for every Able Seaman, and Two Pounds Ten Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, fit for His Majefly's Service, should be paid in the Manner thereby directed to every fuch Able and Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should, on or before the Twenty-eighth Day of February then following, enter themfelves to ferve in His Majefty's Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of His Majefty's Ships or Veffels, or Officers
