HIS Majesty's Commissioners for managing the Stamp Duties do, in pursuance of a subsequent "Act" of the last Session of Parliament, "for allowing further Time for Persons to take out Certificates for using or wearing Hair-Powder," hereby give Notice, that whereas, from the short Period of Time allowed by the former Act for making the Entries required, many Persons using Hair-Powder may, through Ignorance, Absence, or some unavoidable Accident, have omitted or neglected to make such Entries, and obtain Certificates for using Hair-Powder in the Manner directed by the said former Act, the Time for the said Purposes is extended until the 20th Day of July instant, **EXCLUSIVE**: Wherefore every Person liable to this Duty, who, on the 5th Day of June last, shall have neglected or omitted to make the Entry, and obtain the Certificate required by the said former Act, but who shall make such Entry and obtain such Certificate before the said 20th Day of July instant, will be indemnified, freed and discharged from all Penalties and Forfeitures incurred by Reason of such Omission or Neglect.
