PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS by an Order in Council, dated the Thirteenth Day of February last, it was ordered by His Majesty, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, in pursuance of an Act passed in the last Session of Parliament, and mentioned in the faid Order, that from and after the Date of the said Order, until the Thirtieth Day of September next, no Person or Persons whatsoever should export, or lay on Board any Ship or Vessel with Intent to export, from any Port or Place of this Kingdom, any Wheat, Rye, Barley, Beer or Bigg, Pease, Beans, Oats, Indian Corn or Maize, or any Meal or Flour, or Bread, Biscuit or Malt made thereof, subject to the Provisoes and Exceptions in the faid Order contained; and further, that it should be lawful, for the same limited Time, to import anto any Port or Place of this Kingdom any Foreign Corn or Articles as aforesaid, in any British Ship or Vessel, or in any other Ship or Vessel belonging to Persons of any Kingdom or State in Amity with His Majesty, and navigated in any Manner whatever, without Payment of any Duty whatfoever; and also to take out of Warehouse, for Home Confumption, any fuch Foreign Corn or other Articles as aforesaid, without Payment of any Duty whatfoever: And whereas it is judged expedient that the faid Prohibition to export,
