WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament made and passed in the Thirty-fifth Year of the Roign of His present Majesty, intituled, " An Act ? r " Improving the Drainage of the Middle and South " Levels, Part of the Great Level of the Fens " called Bedford Level, and the Low Lands adjin-" ing or near to the faid Levels, as also the Lands " adjoining or near to the River Ouze, in the County of Norfolk, draining through the same to Sea by the Harbour of King's Lynn, in the faid County, and for altering and improving re " Navigation of the faid River Ouze from or n ar " a Place called Eau Brink, in the Parish of Wit-"genhall Saint Mary, in the faid County, to te faid Harbour of King's Lynn, and for improveming and preferving the Navigation of the feveral "Rivers communicating with the faid River Ouze," a yearly Tax of Four-pence per Acre is rated, taxed, charged and affessed upon certain Lands, Grounds and Commons, and also a Tonnage of Four-pence per Ton upon certain Goods.
