Surrogate or Surrogates, as also the several Courts of Admiralty within His Majesty's Dominions, to take Cognizance of, and judicially proceed upon all and all Manner of Captures, Seizures, Prizes and Reprizals of all Ships and Goods that are or shall b. taken, and to hear and determine the fame; and, seconding to the Course of Admiralty, and the Laws or Nations, to adjudge and condemn all fuch Ships, Veilels and Goods as shall belong to the United Provinces, or their Vassals and Subjects, or to any others inhabiti g within any of the Countries, Territories a .1 Domi. ions of the aforesaid United Provinces; and that fach Powers and Claufes be inferted in the fiid Commission as have been usual, and are according to former Precedents: And they are likewife to prepare, and lay before His Majesty at this Board, a Draught of fuch Inflicuctions as may be proper to be fent to the Courts of Admiralty in His Majefty's Foreign Governments and Plantations, for their Guidance herein; as also another Draught of Instructons for such Ships as shall be commissionated for Le Pu poses aforementioned.

GEORGE R.

HEREAS Our Parliament stands prorogued to Theriday the First Day of October next; We, with the Advice of Our Privy Council, do hereby publish and declare, That the faid Parliament shall be further prorogued, on the faid First Day of October, to Thursday the Twenty-ninth Day of October. One thousand seven hundred and ninetyfive: And We have given Order to Our Chancellor of Great Britain to prepare a Commission for proroguing the same accordingly: And We do hereby further declare Our Royal Will and Pleasure, That the faid Parliament shall, on the faid Twenty-ninth Day of October, One thousand seven hundred and ninerv five, be held for the Dispatch of divers weighty and important Affairs. And the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens and Burgesses, and the Commissioners for Shires and Burghs of the House of Commons, are hereby required to give Attendance accordingly at Westminfter, on the said Twenty-ninth Day of October, Une thousand seven hundred and ninety five.

Given at Our Court at Weymouth, the Fiftcenth Day of September, One thousand seven hundred and ninety five, in the Thirty-fifth Year of Our Reign.

PRESENT, The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

THEREAS His Majesty was pleased, by His Order in Council of the 15th of July last, to order, That no Person or Persons whatever should, until further Order, directly or indirectly, export, transport, carry or convey, or cause or procure to be exported, transported, carried or conveyed, any Rice out of or from any Port or Place in Great Britain; or load or lay on Board, or cause or procure to be loaded or laid on Board of any Ship, Vessel or Boat, any Rice, in order to be exported, transported, carried or conveyed out of any Port or Place in Great Britain, (except as in the said Order is excepted): And whereas it has been reprefented by the Merchants, Importers of Rice from South Carolina, That the various Dealers in the Article of Rice, for Home Confumption, being amply supplied, the said Importers can no longer find Sale for confiderable Quantities which remain on Hand, and that they are apprehensive, if the faid Prohibition cortinues, that a very small Portion of the new Crop of Rice will be brought to this Kingdom; His Majesty, taking the same into Consideration, is pleased, by and with the Advice of his Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, That the faid Prohibition, laid by His Majesty's faid Order
