Vessels and Goods belonging to the United Provinces, or their Subjects, or others inhabiting within any of the Territories of the aforesaid United Provinces, and bring the same to Judgment in any of the Courts of Admiralty within His Majesty's Dominion:: And to that End His Majesty's Advocate General, with the Advocate of the Admiralty, are forthwith to prepare the Draught of a Commission, and present the same to His Majesty at this Board, authorizing the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral, or any Person or Perfons by them empowered and appointed, to iffue forth and grant Letters of Marque and Reprizal to any of His Majesty's Subjects, or others, whom the faid Commissioners shall deem fitly qualified in that Behalf, for the apprehending, feizing and taking the Ships, Vessels and Goods belonging to the United Provinces, and their Vasials and Subjects, or any inhabiting within the Countries, Territories or Dominions of the aforesaid United Provinces; and that fuch Powers and Clauses be inserted in the faid Commission as have been usual, and are according to former Precedents. And His Majesty's said Advocate General, with the Advocate of the Admiralty, are also forthwith to prepare the Draught of a Commission, and present the same to His Majesty at this Board, authorizing the faid Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral to will and require the High Court of Admiralty of Great Briand the Lieutenant and Judge of the faid Court, his Surrogate or Surrogates, as also the several Courts of Admiralty within His Majesty's Dominions, to take Cognizance of, and judicially proceed upon all and all Manner of Captures, Seizures, Prizes and Reprizals of all Ships and Goods that are or shall be taken, and to hear and determine the fame; and, according to the Course of Admiralty, and the Laws of Nations, to adjudge and condemn all fuch Ships, Vessels and Goods as shall belong to the United Provinces, or their Vassals and Subjects, or to any others inhabiting within any of the Countries, Territories and Dominions of the aforesaid United Provinces; and that such Powers and Clauses be inserted in the faid Commission as have been usual, and are according to former Precedents: And they are likewise to prepare, and lay before His Majesty at this Board, a Draught of fuch Instructions as may be proper to be sent to the Courts of Admiralty in His Majesty's Foreign Governments and Plantations, for their Guidance herein; as also another Draught of Instructions for fuch Ships as shall be commissionated for the Purpoles aforementioned.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. HEREAS His Majesty was pleased, by His Order in Council of the 15th of July last, to order, That no Person or Persons whatever should, until further Order, directly or indirectly, export, transport, carry or convey, or cause or procure to be exported, transported, carried or conveyed, any Rice out of or from any Port or Place in Great Britain; or load or lay on Board, or cause or procure to be loaded or laid on Board of any Ship, Vessel or Boat, any Rice, in order to be exported, transported, carried or conveyed out of any Port or Place in Great Britain, (except as in the said Order is excepted): And whereas it has been reprefented by the Merchants, Importers of Rice from South Carolina, That the various Dealers in the Article of Rice, for Home Confumption, being amply supplied, the faid Importers can no longer find Sale for confiderable Quantities which remain on Hand, and that they are apprehensive, if the said Prohibition continues, that a very small Portion of the new Crop of Rice will be brought to this Kingdom; His Majesty, taking the same into Consideration, is pleafed, by and with the Advice of his Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, That the faid Prohibition, laid by His Majesty's said Order in Council of the 15th Day of July last, be taken off, and that the Exportation of Rice be permitted and allowed, upon the same Conditions, and under the same Restrictions, as before the islaing of the faid Order of the 15th Day of July last, and as if fuch Order had not been made; any Thing in the faid Order contained to the contrary notwithstanding. And the Right Honorable the Lords Commifsioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary Directions herein accordingly.
