Extract of a Letter from Vice-Admiral Kingfmill to Evan Nepean, Efg; dated on Board L'Engageante, in Cork Harbour, the 21st of September, 1795.

H IS Majefty's Ship Seahorfe is just returned from her Cruize. Captain Peyton informs me, that on the 29th of August the Squadron fell in with Two Ships and a Brig. The Seahorfe took one Ship, which proved to be a Dutch East India Ship, called the Cromhout ; the Diana took the other Ship, a South Whaler, laden with Oil and Coffee, called the Herstilder; and that the Unicorn parted in Chace of the Comet Brig of War.

ExtraSt of a Letter from the fame, dated the 28th of September.

HIS Maje "y's Ship the Unicorn arrived here Verlerday, with her Prize the Comet Dutch Sloop of War, mounting 18 English Nine-Pounders. I have examinal the latter clofely, and think the is the complexity Voffel of her Clafs that I ever heard of, and even exceeds the Opinion given me of her by the incloied Letter from Captain Williams. Copy of a Letter from Captain Williams to Vice Admiral Kingsmill, dated Unicorn, at Sea, th^e 5th of September, 1795.

SIR,

I Beg Leave to inform you, that, on the 23th Ultimo, when cruizing, in Conjunction with His Majetty's Ships Diana and Seahorfe, in Latitude 61 deg. 18 min. Longitude 4 deg. 17 min. the Signal was made by Captain Faulknor, of His Majefly's Ship Unicorn, under my Com-mand, to part Company and chace, N. N. E. after a Brig, that had outfailed and feparated from Two Ships, which the Squadron were then in Purfuit of. After a Chace of Thirteen Hours, I was fo fortunate as to come up with her, and, when the had dicharged her Guns and ftruck her Colours, to take Poffeffion of her. She proves to be the Comet, a Dutch Sloop of War, mounting 18 Nine-Pound rs, commanded by Mynheer Claris, Captain-Lieutenant, from the Cape of Good Hope, bound to the Texel. The Comet is a remarkably fine Veffe!, only Four Years old, fails extremely well, and is in every Respect well calculated for His Majefty's Service.
