P R E S E N T,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Countries belonging to the United Provinces have, for some Time past, been, and still continue, in the Possession of the Armies of France, and under the immediate Influence and Direction of the Persons who exercise the Powers of Government in France: And whereas divers injurious Proceedings have lately been had in the said United Provinces, in Derogation of the Honour of His Majesty's Crown, and the just Rights of His Subjects; and Ships of War, fitted out from the Ports of the said United Provinces, have received Orders to take and destroy all British Vessels, and some British Vessels have been actually so taken:—His Majesty, therefore, being determined to take such Measures as are necessary for vindicating the Honour of His Crown, and for procuring Reparation and Satisfaction, is pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that General Reprizals be granted against the Ships, Goods and Subjects of the United Provinces, so that as well His Majesty's Fleet and Ships, as also all other Ships and Vessels that shall be commissioned by Letters of Marque or General Reprizals, or otherwise, by His Majesty's Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, shall and may lawfully seize all Ships,

Vessels and Goods belonging to the United Provinces, or their Subjects, or others inhabiting within any of the Territories of the aforesaid United Provinces, and bring the same to Judgment in any of the Courts of Admiralty within His Majesty's Dominions: And to that End His Majesty's Advocate General, with the Advocate of the Admiralty, are forthwith to prepare the Draught of a Commission, and present the same to His Majesty at this Board, authorizing the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral, or any Person or Persons by them empowered and appointed, to issue forth and grant Letters of Marque and Reprizal to any of His Majesty's Subjects, or others, whom the said Commissioners shall deem fitly qualified in that Behalf, for the apprehending, seizing and taking the Ships, Vessels and Goods belonging to the United Provinces, and their Vassals and Subjects, or any inhabiting within the Countries, Territories or Dominions of the aforesaid United Provinces; and that such Powers and Clauses be inserted in the said Commission as have been usual, and are according to former Precedents. And His Majesty's said Advocate General, with the Advocate of the Admiralty, are also forthwith to prepare the Draught of a Commission, and present the same to His Majesty at this Board, authorizing the said Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral to will and require the High Court of Admiralty of Great Britain and the Lieutenant and Judge of the said Court, his

Surrogate or Surrogates, as also the several Courts of Admiralty within His Majesty's Dominions, to take Cognizance of, and judicially proceed upon all and all Manner of Captures, Seizures, Prizes and Reprizals of all Ships and Goods that are or shall be taken, and to hear and determine the same; and, according to the Course of Admiralty, and the Laws of Nations, to adjudge and condemn all such Ships, Vessels and Goods as shall belong to the United Provinces, or their Vassals and Subjects, or to any others inhabiting within any of the Countries, Territories and Dominions of the aforesaid United Provinces; and that such Powers and Clauses be inserted in the said Commission as have been usual, and are according to former Precedents: And they are likewise to prepare, and lay before His Majesty at this Board, a Draught of such Instructions as may be proper to be sent to the Courts of Admiralty in His Majesty's Foreign Governments and Plantations, for their Guidance herein; as also another Draught of Instructions for such Ships as shall be commissioned for the Purposes aforementioned.

BY Order of the Earl Cholmondeley, Notice is hereby given, that every Creditor of His Royal Highness, whose Demand shall accrue after the 5th Day of July, 1795, is to deliver into this Office a Particular, in Writing, containing the Nature and Amount of such Demand, signed by him or her, within Ten Days after the Expiration of the Quarter of a Year in which such Demand shall accrue; and all Debts or Demands, of what Nature or Kind soever, which shall not wholly have accrued within the

preceding Quarter of a Year, or which shall not be presented as aforesaid, and within the Time limited as aforesaid, are not, under any Pretence or Colour of Authority whatever, to be paid, satisfied, or discharged, nor any Part thereof, but are barred both at Law and in Equity; and all Bonds, Bills, Notes, or other Securities for Money, given or made in Consideration of any Debt or Demand, whereof the Particulars in Writing are not delivered as aforesaid, are, to all Intents and Purposes, null and void.

WHEREAS it has been humbly represented to the King, that in the Night of the 3d, or early in the Morning of the 4th of August last the Custom-House at Shoreham in the County of Sussex, was feloniously broke open by some evil-disposed Person or Persons unknown, who rummaged the Desks of the Collector, and various other Officers belonging to the said Custom-House, and feloniously took and carried away out of the Desk of the said Collector the Sum of 40l.
